Special Conditions

1. Auction

- 1.1 If the property is sold by public auction then the property is offered for sale by public auction, subject to the vendors reserve price. The rules for the conduct of the auction shall be as set out in the schedule of the Sale of Land Regulations or any rules prescribed by regulations which modify or replace those rules.
- 1.2 The successful bidder shall immediately on the fall of the hammer sign this contract and pay the full 10% deposit to the Vendors agent.

2. Acceptance of title

General condition 12.4 is added:

Where the Purchaser is deemed by section 27(7) of the Sale of Land Act 1962 to have given the deposit release authorisation referred to in section 27(1), the purchaser is also deemed to have accepted title in the absence of any prior express objection to title

3. Foreign resident capital gains withholding

- 3.1 Words defined or used in Subdivision 14-D of Schedule 1 to the *Taxation Administration Act 1953 (Cth)* have the same meaning this special condition unless the context requires otherwise.
- 3.2 Every vendor under this contract is a foreign resident for the purposes of this special condition unless the Vendor gives the Purchaser a special clearance certificate issued by the Commissioner under section 14-200 (1) of Schedule 1 to the Taxation Administration Act 1953 (Cth). The specified period in the clearance certificate must include the actual date of settlement.
- 3.3 This special condition only applies if the Purchaser is required to pay the Commissioner an amount in accordance with section 14-200(3) or section 14-235 of Schedule 1 to the *Taxation Administration Act 1953 (Cth)* ("the amount") because one or more of the vendors is a foreign resident, the property is or will have a market value of \$750,000 or more just after the transaction, and the transaction is not excluded under section 14-215(1) of Schedule 1 to the *Taxation Administration Act 1953 (Cth)*.
- 3.4 The amount is to be deducted from the Vendor's entitlement to the contract consideration. The Vendor must pay to the Purchaser at settlement such part of the amount as is represented by non-monetary consideration.
- 3.5 The Purchaser must:
- (a) engage a Legal Practitioner or Conveyancer ("representative") to conduct all legal aspects of settlement, including the performance of the Purchaser's obligations in this special condition; and
- (b) ensure that the representative does so.
- 3.6 The terms of the representative's engagement are taken to include instructions to have regard to the Vendor's interests and instructions that the representative must:
- (a) pay, or ensure payment of, the amount to the Commissioner in the manner required by the Commissioner as soon as reasonably and practicably possible, from moneys under the control or direction of the representative in accordance with this special condition if the sale of the property settles;
- (b) promptly provide the vendor with proof of payment; and
- (c) otherwise comply, or ensure compliance with, this special condition;

despite

- (d) any contrary instructions, other than from both the Purchaser and the Vendor; and
- (e) any other provision in this contract to the contrary.
- 3.7 The representative is taken to have complied with the obligations in special condition 1B.6 if;
- (a) the settlement is conducted through the electronic conveyancing system operated by Property Exchange Australia Ltd or any other electronic conveyancing system agreed by the parties; and
- (b) the amount is included in the settlement statement requiring payment to the Commissioner in respect of this transaction.
- 3.8 Any clearance certificate or document evidencing variation of the amount in accordance with section 14-253(2) of Schedule 1 to the *Taxation Administration Act 1953 (Cth)* must be given to the Purchaser at least 5 business days before the due date for settlement.
- The Vendor must provide the Purchaser with such information as the Purchaser requires to comply with the Purchaser's obligation to pay the amount in accordance with section 14-200 of Schedule 1 to the *Taxation Administration Act 1953 (Cth)*. The information must be provided within 5 business days of request by the Purchaser. The Vendor warrants that the information the Vendor provides is true and correct.
- 3.10 The Purchaser is responsible for any penalties or interest payable to the Commissioner on account of late payment of the amount.

4. Electronic Conveyancing

EC

Settlement and lodgement will be conducted electronically in accordance with the Electronic Conveyancing National Law and special condition 2 applies, if the box is marked "EC"

- 4.1 This special condition has priority over any other provision to the extent of any inconsistency. This special condition applies if the contract of sale specifies, or the parties subsequently agree in writing, that settlement and lodgement of the instruments necessary to record the Purchaser as registered proprietor of the land will be conducted electronically in accordance with the Electronic Conveyancing National Law.
- 4.2 A party must immediately give written notice if that party reasonably believes that settlement and lodgement can no longer be conducted electronically.
- 4.3 Each party must:
- (a) be, or engage a representative who is, a subscriber for the purposes of the Electronic Conveyancing National Law;
- (b) ensure that all other persons for whom that party is responsible and who are associated with this transaction are, or engage, a subscriber for the purposes of the Electronic Conveyancing National Law; and
- (c) conduct the transaction in accordance with the Electronic Conveyancing National Law.
- 4.4 The Vendor must open the Electronic Workspace ("workspace") as soon as reasonably practicable. The workspace is an electronic address for the service of notices and for written communications for the purposes of any electronic transactions legislation.
- 4.5 The Vendor must nominate a time of the day for locking of the workspace at least 7 days before the due date for settlement.
- 4.6 Settlement occurs when the workspace records that:
- (a) the exchange of funds or value between financial institutions in accordance with the instructions of the parties has occurred; or
- (b) if there is no exchange of funds or value, the documents necessary to enable the Purchaser to become registered proprietor of the land have been accepted for electronic lodgement.
- 4.7 The parties must do everything reasonably necessary to effect settlement:
- (a) electronically on the next business day; or
- (b) at the option of either party, otherwise than electronically as soon as possible if, after the locking of the workspace at the nominated settlement time, settlement in accordance with special condition 2.6 has not occurred by 4.00 pm, or by 6.00 pm if the nominated time for settlement is after 4.00 pm.
- 4.8 Each party must do everything reasonably necessary to assist the other party to trace and identify the recipient of any missing or mistaken payment and to recover the missing or mistaken payment.
- 4.9 The Vendor must before settlement:
- (a) deliver any keys, security devices and codes ("keys") to the estate agent named in the contract,
- (b) direct the estate agent to give the keys to the Purchaser or the Purchaser's nominee on notification of settlement by the Vendor, the Vendor's subscriber or the Electronic Network Operator,
- (c) deliver all other physical documents and items (other than the goods sold by the contract) to which the Purchaser is entitled at settlement, and any keys if not delivered to the Estate Agent, to the Vendor's subscriber or, if there is no Vendor's subscriber, confirm in writing to the Purchaser that the vendor holds those documents, items and keys at the Vendor's address set out in the contract, and
- (d) direct the Vendor's subscriber to give (or, if there is no Vendor's subscriber, give) all those documents and items, and any such keys, to the Purchaser or the Purchaser's nominee on notification of settlement by the Electronic Network Operator.
- 4.10 The Vendor must, at least 3 days before the due date for settlement, provide the original of any document required to be prepared by the Vendor in accordance with general condition 6.

5. GST withholding

- 5.1 Words and expressions defined or used in Subdivision 14-E of Schedule 1 to the *Taxation Administration Act* 1953 (Cth) or in *A New Tax System (Goods and Services Tax) Act* 1999 (Cth) have the same meaning in this general condition unless the context requires otherwise. Words and expressions first used in this general condition and shown in italics and marked with an asterisk are defined or described in at least one of those Acts.
- 5.2 This general condition 15B applies if the purchaser is required to pay the Commissioner an *amount in accordance with section 14-250 of Schedule 1 to the *Taxation Administration Act* 1953 (Cth) because the property is *new residential premises or *potential residential land in either case falling within the parameters of that section, and also if the sale attracts the operation of section 14-255 of the legislation. Nothing in this general condition 15B is to be taken as relieving the vendor from compliance with section 14-255.
- 5.3 The amount is to be deducted from the vendor's entitlement to the contract *consideration and is then taken to be paid to the vendor, whether or not the vendor provides the purchaser with a GST withholding notice in accordance with section 14-255 of Schedule 1 to the *Taxation Administration Act* 1953 (Cth). The vendor must pay to the purchaser at settlement such part of the amount as is represented by non-monetary consideration.

- 5.4 The purchaser must:
- (a) engage a legal practitioner or conveyancer ("representative") to conduct all the legal aspects of settlement, including the performance of the purchaser's obligations under the legislation and this general condition; and
- (b) ensure that the representative does so.
- 5.5 The terms of the representative's engagement are taken to include instructions to have regard to the vendor's interests relating to the payment of the amount to the commissioner and instructions that the representative must:
- (a) pay, or ensure payment of, the amount to the Commissioner in the manner required by the Commissioner and as soon as reasonably and practicably possible, from moneys under the control or direction of the representative in accordance with this general condition on settlement of the sale of the property;
- (b) promptly provide the vendor with evidence of payment, including any notification or other document provided by the purchaser to the Commissioner relating to payment; and
- (c) otherwise comply, or ensure compliance, with this general condition;

despite:

- (d) any contrary instructions, other than from both the purchaser and the vendor; and
- (e) any other provision in this contract to the contrary.
- 5.6 The representative is taken to have complied with the requirements of general condition 15B.5 if:
- (a) settlement is conducted through the electronic conveyancing system operated by Property Exchange Australia Ltd or any other electronic conveyancing system agreed by the parties; and
- (b) the amount is included in the settlement statement requiring payment to the Commissioner in respect of this transaction.
- 5.7 The purchaser may at settlement give the vendor a bank cheque for the amount in accordance with section 16-30 (3) of Schedule 1 to the *Taxation Administration Act* 1953 (Cth), but only if:
- (a) so agreed by the vendor in writing; and
- (b) the settlement is not conducted through an electronic settlement system described in general condition 15B.6.

However, if the purchaser gives the bank cheque in accordance with this general condition 15B.7, the vendor must:

- (c) immediately after settlement provide the bank cheque to the Commissioner to pay the amount in relation to the supply; and
- (d) give the purchaser a receipt for the bank cheque which identifies the transaction and includes particulars of the bank cheque, at the same time the purchaser gives the vendor the bank cheque.
- 5.8 The vendor must provide the purchaser with a GST withholding notice in accordance with section 14-255 of Schedule 1 to the *Taxation Administration* Act 1953 (Cth) at least 14 days before the due date for settlement.
- 5.9 A party must provide the other party with such information as the other party requires to:
- (a) decide if an amount is required to be paid or the quantum of it, or
- (b) comply with the purchaser's obligation to pay the amount,

in accordance with section 14-250 of Schedule 1 of the *Taxation Administration Act* 1953 (Cth). The information must be provided within 5 business days of a written request. The party providing the information warrants that it is true and correct.

- 5.10 The vendor warrants that:
- (a) at settlement, the property is not new residential premises or potential residential land in either case falling within the parameters of section 14-250 of Schedule 1 to the *Taxation Administration Act* 1953 (Cth) if the vendor gives the purchaser a written notice under section 14-255 to the effect that the purchaser will not be required to make a payment under section 14-250 in respect of the supply, or fails to give a written notice as required by and within the time specified in section 14-255; and
- (b) the amount described in a written notice given by the vendor to the purchaser under section 14-255 of Schedule 1 to the *Taxation Administration Act* 1953 (Cth) is the correct amount required to be paid under section 14-250 of the legislation.
- 5.11 The purchaser is responsible for any penalties or interest payable to the commissioner on account of non-payment or late payment of the amount, except to the extent that:
- (a) the penalties or interest arise from the vendor's failure, including breach of a warranty in general condition 15B.10; or
- (b) the purchaser's reasonable belief that the property is neither new residential premises nor potential residential land requiring the purchaser to pay an amount to the Commissioner in accordance with section 14-250 (1) of Schedule 1 to the *Taxation*

Administration Act 1953 (Cth)

The vendor is responsible for any penalties or interest payable to the commissioner on account of non-payment or late payment of the amount if either exception applies.

5.12 This general condition will not merge on settlement.

6. Interpretation.

In the interpretation of this contract where the context permits;

- (a) Words importing either gender shall be deemed to include the other gender.
- (b) Words importing the singular number shall be deemed to include the plural and vice versa;
- (c) Where there are two or more Purchasers the agreements and obligations of the Purchaser hereunder shall bind them jointly and each of them severally.

7. Whole Contract.

The Purchaser acknowledges and agrees that:

- 7.1 The Purchaser was given a Vendors Statement before signing this Contract;
- 7.2 No information, representations or warranty of the Vendor, the Vendors Conveyancer or the Vendor's Agent was supplied or made with the intention or knowledge that it would be relied upon by the Purchaser;
- 7.3 The Purchaser has relied on its judgement in purchasing the Property and has inspected the property including all improvements, fixtures and Chattels as set out in the Contract.
- 7.4 No warranty has been given as the condition or quality of the improvements, fixtures, fittings or Chattels.
- 7.5 No brochure, investment report or advertising material is to be relied on as an accurate description of the property.
- 7.5 This contract forms the entire agreement between the Vendor and the Purchaser.

8. Land Identity.

The Purchaser admits that the land offered for sale and inspected by them is identical to that described in the attached title. The Purchaser shall not make any requisition in respect of or claim any compensation for any alleged miss description of the land or deficiency in its area or measurements or any patent or latent defects in the land or call upon the Vendor to amend Title or to bear all or any part of the cost of doing so.

9. Condition Of The Property.

- 9.1 The Purchaser warrants to the vendor that as a result of the Purchaser's inspections and enquiries concerning the property, the Purchaser is satisfied with the condition, quality and state of repair of the property and accepts the property as it is and subject to any defects, need for repair or infestation.
- 9.2 The Purchaser will not make any claim or requisition or delay this transaction or rescind or terminate this contract because of anything concerning the matters referred to in these special conditions or in respect of any loss, damage, need for repair relating to the property or the requirements of a statutory authority made on or after the day of sale.
- 9.3 The Purchaser acknowledges that the improvements may be subject to or require compliance with current building regulations, municipal by-laws or any other statutory provisions or regulations or any repealed laws under which the improvements were constructed. A failure to comply with any such regulations or laws will not constitute a defect in the Vendor's title and the Purchaser must not delay settlement or refuse to settle, or make any requisition or claim any compensation from the Vendor on that ground.
- 9.4 The Purchaser acknowledges that if there is a swimming pool or spa on the property which is or may require the installation of barriers or fencing as appropriate by the building regulations or the requirement for any permits or approvals and the requirement for obtaining compliance and registration as appropriate, the Purchaser must comply, at the Purchaser's cost and expense, with the building and government authorities and regulations within 30 days of Settlement. The Purchaser acknowledges ad agrees that the Vendor makes no warranty or no representation for any permits or approvals, registration or compliance for the Swimming pool or spa. Upon signing this Contract of Sale, the Purchaser acknowledges and agrees that the Purchaser shall bear full responsibility for any fines, notices or orders issued after the date of the Purchaser signing the Contract with respect to the Pool and Spa registration, compliance or any works required in relations to the Pool/Spa, requirements for Fencing/Compliance or Permits. The Purchaser indemnifies and keeps indemnified the Vendor on and from the day of sale in respect of all notice, orders or legal requirements under the building regulations.
- 9.5 The land and buildings and improvements, if any has sold hereby and inspected by the Purchaser are sold on the basis of existing improvements thereon and the Purchaser shall not make any claim, requisition or rescind the Contract:
- 9.5 (a) For any deficiency or defect in the said improvements, whether as to their suitability for occupation, compliance with laws or otherwise or;
- 9.5 (b) In relations to the issue or non-issuance of building permits of the said improvements; or
- 9.5 (c) In relations to the completion of inspections by the relevant authorities in respect of the said improvements

9.6 General Condition 12 is Deleted from this Contract.

9.7 The Purchaser acknowledges that the Vendor makes no warranty or representation that any improvements on the land sold or any alterations or additions or renovations thereto comply with the requirements of the VBA Regulations, Council By-Laws relevant statues and any regulations by any responsible authorities.

Any such failure of any building or improvements on the land to comply with the planning, health, environmental building and other legislations, VBA Regulations, Council By-Laws relevant statues and any regulations by any responsible authorities and encroachments by or on the land there under shall not constitute a defect in the Vendor's title. The Purchaser shall not make any requisition, claim or compensation in relation to the issuance or non-issuance of the Building and Occupancy Permits/Final Inspections and other permits by the relevant authorities in respect of any improvements, additions, alterations thereon.

Purchaser acknowledges having inspected the Property hereby sold and save as is otherwise expressly provided, acknowledges that the Purchaser is purchasing the Property in its present condition and state of repair and that the Vendor is under no liability or obligation to the Purchaser to carry out any repairs, renovations, alterations or improvements to the Property sold. Upon signing of the Contract of Sale the Purchaser assumes full responsibility and liability in relation to special condition 9.7 and the purchaser shall make no request, claims, seek compensation or delay settlement, rescind and terminate the Contract whatsoever because of special condition 9.7 The Purchaser indemnifies and keeps the Vendor indemnified on and from the day of sale in respect to the special condition.

9.8 The Purchaser acknowledges that the Vendor makes no warranty or no representation for any permits or approvals for the property or any improvements, alterations or additions to the property. Upon signing of the Contract of Sale the Purchaser assumes full responsibility and liability in relation to special condition 9.8 and the purchaser shall make no request,

claims, seek compensation or delay settlement, rescind and terminate the Contract whatsoever because of special condition 9.8

The Vendor will not be required to procure any building permit, building approval, final inspection, Occupancy Permits or any other permits, approvals or inspections in relations to the land or any improvements, upgrades, extension or alterations and the purchasers shall not make any requisition or claim any compensation from the Vendor on that ground.

The Purchaser accepts the land or improvements on and the services on and to the land in their present condition, position and state of repair and subject to all fault or defects both latent and patent.

The Purchaser indemnifies and keeps the Vendor indemnified on and from the day of sale in respect to the special condition.

9.9 The Purchaser agrees to make their own enquiries with any authority or Party they may presume applicable or relevant of any particulars of any notice, order, declaration, deed, report or recommendation of a public authority or government department or approved proposal directly and currently affecting the land, and the Purchaser agrees to assume, to the fullest extent permitted by law or equity, complete responsibility and liability for and comply with all the requirements and obligations of all notices, orders, declarations, deeds, reports or recommendations served in the respect of the Property, including any Notice, Order, declaration, deed, report or recommendation contained in the Contract herein, if any, whether the service is on the Vendor or otherwise, on or before or after the day of sale or settlement. Failure of disclosure of any such notices or orders, declaration, deed, report or recommendation to the Purchaser or failure of compliance with any notices or orders, declaration, deed, report or recommendation by the Vendor does not constitute a defect in the vendor's title or affects the validity of this contract and the purchaser shall make no request, claims, seek compensation or delay settlement or rescind the Contract whatsoever because of this special condition.

The Purchaser indemnifies and keeps the Vendor indemnified on and from the day of sale in respect to the special condition.

10. Improvements.

The Purchaser acknowledges that any improvements on the property may be subject to or require compliance with the Victorian Building Regulations, municipal by-laws, relevant statutes or any other regulations. Any failure to comply with any one or more of those laws or regulations shall not be deemed to constitute a defect in the Vendor's title and the Purchaser shall not make any requisition or claim any compensation from the Vendor. The Purchaser must not delay settlement or refuse to settle nor require the Vendor to comply with any one or more of those laws or regulations, or provide any documents including any requirements to fence any pool or spa, or install smoke detectors.

11. Planning.

The Purchaser buys the property subject to any restrictions imposed by the provisions of any applicable town planning act, orders, plans, schemes, local government by-laws or other enactment or any authority empowered to make restrictions. Any such restrictions shall not constitute a defect in the Vendor's title and the Purchaser shall not make any requisition, or objection, nor be entitled to any compensation from the Vendor in respect thereof. The Purchaser must not delay settlement or refuse to settle. Save for any warranties or representations, which cannot be legally excluded with respect to the use of the said land or any part thereof.

12. Restrictions.

The property is sold subject to all easements, covenants, leases/licences, encumbrances, appurtenant easements and encumbrances and restrictions (if any) as set out herein or attached hereto. The Purchaser should make their own enquiries whether any structure or buildings are constructed over any easements prior to signing the Contract, otherwise the Purchaser accepts the location of all buildings and shall not make any claim in relation thereto and must not delay settlement or refuse to settle.

13. Settlement.

- (a) Should settlement take place via paper and not Electronic Conveyancing, settlement shall take place no later than 3.00pm (Eastern Standard Time) on the settlement date, failing which settlement shall be deemed to take place on the next business day. Should settlement take place via Electronic Conveyancing, settlement shall take place no later than 4.00pm (Eastern Standard Time) on the settlement date, failing which settlement shall be deemed to take place on the next business day.
- (b) Should settlement take place via paper and not Electronic Conveyancing, settlement shall take place at the office of the Vendor's representative or at such other place in Victoria as the Vendor directs.
- (c) Should settlement take place via paper and not Electronic Conveyancing, and should settlement be directed by the choice of the

- Purchaser with the approval of the Vendor, the Purchaser will pay a settlement fee to the Vendor's representative of \$450.00 Plus GST. This fee will be due and payable at settlement.
- (d) Should settlement take place via paper and not Electronic Conveyancing, and settlement has been attended to and falls through at the fault of the Purchaser, the Purchaser will pay a re-attendance fee to the Vendor's representative of \$450.00 Plus GST, along with any other costs incurred due to the breach of the Purchaser. This fee is due and payable on the next scheduled settlement time/date
- (e) Should settlement take place via paper and not Electronic Conveyancing, at settlement, the Purchaser must pay the fees up to six cheques drawn on an authorised deposit-taking institution.
- (f) Without limiting any other rights of the Vendor, If the Purchaser fails to settle on the due date for settlement as set out in the particulars of sale to this contract (due date) or request an extension to the due date, the Purchaser must pay to the Vendor's representative an amount of \$220.00 plus GST representing the Vendor's additional legal cost and disbursements, along with any other costs incurred due to the breach of the Purchaser.

14. Licence Agreement.

The purchaser acknowledges should they request a licence agreement, and should the Vendor agree, the licence must be prepared by the vendors representative at the cost of the purchaser. The fee to prepare the licence is \$450.00 plus GST and shall be adjusted for and payable at settlement.

15. Guarantee & Indemnity.

15.1 Immediately after being requested to do so by the Vendor, procure the execution by all directors of the Purchaser (of if the Vendor requires by the shareholders) of a guarantee and indemnity to be prepared by the Vendor's representative and to be substantially the same form as the guarantee annexed to this contract but with the necessary changes being made.

16. Foreign Acquisitions and Takeovers Act 1975.

- 16.1 If ticked 'No' after the words 'FIRB approval Required?' in the particulars of sale page or this section of the particulars of sale is not complete, the Purchaser:
- 16.1.1 warrants to the vendor, as an essential term of this contract, that the acquisition of the property by the purchaser does not fall within the scope of the Takeover Act and is not examinable by FIRB: and
- 16.2 If the box is ticked YES after the words 'FIRB Approval required?' in the particulars of sale, then the Purchaser:
- 16.2.1 must, as an essential term of this contract, promptly after the day of sale take all reasonable endeavours to obtain FIRB approval pursuant to the Takeover Act of this purchase and will keep the vendor informed of the progress of the FIRB Approval application and provide evidence of the FIRB approval to the vendor
- 16.2.2 The Purchaser must give written notice to the Vendor's solicitor that approval has not been obtained by 4pm on the date which is 30 days after the day of sale, whereupon the Contract will be terminated, and all monies paid by the Purchaser shall be refunded in full. If the Purchaser has not advised the Vendor in writing that the Purchaser has obtained approval by 4pm on the date which is 30 days after the day of sale, then the Purchaser warrants that they have approval.
- 16.2.3 The Purchaser agrees that if the warranty in special conditions 12.1 is breached, the Purchaser will indemnify the Vendor against any penalties, fines, legal cost, claims, losses or damages which the Vendor suffers as a direct or indirect result of a breach of that warranty

17. Loans / Finance

The purchaser warrants that he has not received any promise from the Vendor's Agent (or any person acting on behalf of the Vendor's agent) in relation to obtaining a loan for the purchase of the property.

18. Indemnity - Estate Agent

The purchaser warrants that he has not been introduced to the vendor or to the property directly or indirectly by any real estate agent other than the agent herein described or other person who might be entitled to claim commission from the vendor in respect of this sale and the purchaser shall indemnify and keep indemnified the vendor, at all times notwithstanding settlement hereof from and against any claim or liability for commission or loss or damages resulting from a breach of this warranty.

19. Adjustments of Outgoings

- 19.1 The Purchaser must provide copies of all certificates and other information used to calculate the adjustments, including land tax. The purchaser is to provide the statement of adjustments to the vendors representative at least 5 business days prior to settlement. A delay in the statement of adjustments will incur a fee of \$242.00 payable at settlement.
- 19.2 If the property is not separately assessed in respect of the outgoings, then the portion of any such outgoings are to be adjusted between the Vendor and the Purchaser will be either on the basis the amount to be apportioned between then is the proportion of the outgoing equal to the proportion which:
- (a) The lot liability of the property bears to the total liability of all of the lots on the plan; or

- (b) The surface area of the property bears to the surface area of the land that is subject to the assessment; or
- 19.2.2 On such other basis,

as the Vendor may reasonably direct the Purchaser on or before the settlement date.

19.3 The Purchaser must pay any special fee or charge levied on the Vendor on and from the day of sale by the Owner's Corporation under the Owner's Corporation act or Owners Corporation Regulations. The special fee or charge will not be subject to appointment between the Vendor and the Purchaser.

20. Stamp Duty - Purchasers Buying in unequal Interest

- 20.1 If there is more than one Purchaser, it is the Purchaser's responsibility to ensure the contract correctly records at the date of sale the proportion in which they are buying the property (the proportions).
- 20.2 If the proportions recorded in the transfer differ from those recorded in the contract, it is the Purchaser's responsibility to pay additional duty, which may be assessed as a result to the variation.
- 20.3 The Purchaser fully indemnifies the Vendor, Vendor's Agent and the Vendor's Conveyancer against any claims or demands which may be made against any or all of them in relation to any additional duty payable as a result of the proportions in the transfer differing from those in the contract.

21. Vendor Statement

The Purchaser acknowledges that prior to signing this Contract or any agreement or document in respect of the sale hereby made which is legally binding upon or intended legally to bind the Purchaser, the Purchaser has been given a statement in writing containing the particulars required by section 32(2) of the Sale of Land Act 1962 (as amended)

22. Trust

If the Purchaser is buying the property as trustee of a Trust (Trust) then;

- 23.1.1 The Purchaser must not do anything to prejudice any right of indemnity the Purchaser may have under the Trust;
- 23.1.2 The Purchaser Warrants that the Purchaser has power under the Trust to enter into this contract;
- 23.1.3 If the Trustee is an individual, that signatory is personally liable under the contract for the due performance of the Purchaser's obligations as if the signatory were the Purchaser in case of default by the Purchaser.
- 23.1.4 The Purchaser warrants that the Purchaser has a right of indemnity under the Trust; and
- 23.1.5 The Purchaser must not allow the variation of the Trust or the advance or distribution of capital of the Trust or resettlement of any property belonging to the Trust.

23. Personal property securities register

Notwithstanding General Condition 11 the Vendor is not obliged to ensure that the Purchaser receives a release, statement, approval or correction in respect of any personal property that is required by the Personal Property Securities Regulations 2009 to be described in a registration by a serial number and is not described by serial number in the PPSR.

24. Solar Panels

If there are any solar panels on the land, the purchaser acknowledges and agrees that:

- 25.1. whether or not any benefits currently provided to the vendor by agreement with the current energy supplier(including with respect to feed-in tariffs) pass to the purchaser on the sale of the land is a matter for enquiry and confirmation by the purchaser, and the vendor makes no representation in this regard;
- 25.2. the purchaser will negotiate with the current energy supplier or an energy supplier of the purchaser's choice with respect to any feed-in tariffs for any electricity generated or any other benefits provided by the solar panels;
- 25.3. the purchaser shall indemnify and hold harmless the vendor against any claims whatsoever with respect to the solar panels; and
- 25.4. neither the vendor nor vendor's estate agent has made any representations or warranties with respect to the solar panels in relation To their condition, state of repair, fitness for purpose for which they are installed, their input to the electricity grid, any benefits arising From and electricity generated by the solar panels, or otherwise.

26. PROPERTY SOLD "AS IS"

The Purchaser acknowledges and agrees:

- 26.1 that the property is purchased by the Purchaser:-
- (a) on an "as is" basis and as a result of the independent exercise of the purchaser's own skill and judgement after due inspection and investigation;
- (b) in its present condition with all existing patent and latent defects; General Condition 31.2, 31.3, 31.4, 31.5 and 31.6 are deleted from this Contract
- (c) Subject to any infestations or dilapidations
- (d) Subject to all non-compliance with the local Government Act or any ordinance under that act in respect of any building on the land.
- 26.2 the Vendor has not made nor shall be construed as having made any representation or warranty that any improvements on the property comply with the Uniform Building Regulations and any other relevant rules regulations or statutory provisions in relation to them or any permit or other authority issued with respect to them.
- 26.3 no representation or warranty has been made or given by the Vendor or by any person acting on behalf of the Vendor to the Purchaser or to any person acting on behalf of the Purchaser as to:
- (i) the marketability, quality or fitness for any purpose of the Property or the improvements;
- (ii) the freedom of the Property from defects, infestation, contamination or dangerous substances;
- (iii) the use to which the Property can lawfully be put; or
- (iv) whether development of any description may be carried out on the Property.

27. NO CLAIM FOR DAMAGES OR COMPENSATION

The Purchaser shall not be entitled to claim any damages or compensation or to delay the settlement of the sale herein by reason of:

- 27.1 the state of cleanliness of any improvement erected on the land herein sold; or
- 27.2 the Vendor leaving on the land herein sold or any improvement erected thereon any item or thing; and the Purchaser shall not be entitled to require the Vendor to remove the same

GUARANTEE & INDEMNITY

TO: The vendor as named in the contract to which this document is attached ('the vendor")

IN CONSIDERATION of the vendor, at the request of the person whose name is set forth after paragraph 2 hereto ('the guarantor"), having agreed to sell the property and chattels (if any) to the purchaser, for the price and other terms as contained in the contract, the guarantor;

1.HEREBY GUARANTEES to the vendor the due and punctual payment by the purchaser of the purchase money and interest thereon as detailed in the contract and all other monies that are payable or may become payable pursuant thereto ("the monies hereby secured') and also the due performance and observance by the purchaser of all and singular the covenants provisions and stipulations contained or implied in the contract and on the part of the purchaser to be performed and observed and the guarantor hereby expressly acknowledges and declares that it has examined the contract and has access to a copy thereof and further that this guarantee us given upon and subject to the following conditions:-

- (a) THAT in the event of the purchaser failing to pay the vendor as and when due the monies hereby secured the guarantor will immediately pay the same to the vendor.
- (b) THAT in the event of the purchaser failing to carry out or perform any of it obligations under the contract the guarantor will immediately carry out and perform same.
- (c) THE guarantor shall be deemed to be jointly and severally liable with the purchaser (in lieu of being merely a surety for it) for the payment of the monies hereby secured and it shall not be necessary for the vendor to make any claim or demand on or to take any action or proceedings against the purchaser before calling on the guarantor to pay the moneys or to carry out and perform the obligations herein contained
- (d) THAT no time or other indulgence whatsoever that may be granted by the vendor to the purchaser shall in any manner whatsoever affect a liability of the guarantor hereunder and the liability of the guarantor shall continue to remain in full force and effect until all monies owing to the vendor have been paid and all obligations have been performed.

General Conditions

Contract signing

1. ELECTRONIC SIGNATURE

- 1.1 In this general condition "electronic signature "means a digital signature or a visual representation of a person's handwritten signature or mark which is placed on a physical or electronic copy of this contract by electronic or mechanical means, and "electronically signed" has a corresponding meaning.
- 1.2 The parties consent to this contract being signed by or on behalf of a party by an electronic signature.
- 1.3 Where this contract is electronically signed by or on behalf of a party, the party warrants and agrees that the electronic signature has been used to identify the person signing and to indicate that the party intends to be bound by the electronic signature.
- 1.4 This contract may be electronically signed in any number of counterparts which together will constitute the one document.
- 1.5 Each party consents to the exchange of counterparts of this contract by delivery by email or such other electronic means as may be agreed in writing.
- 1.6 Each party must upon request promptly deliver a physical counterpart of this contract with the handwritten signature or signatures of the party and all written evidence of the authority of a person signing on their behalf, but a failure to comply with the request does not affect the validity of this contract.

2. LIABILITY OF SIGNATORY

Any signatory for a proprietary limited company purchaser is personally liable for the due performance of the purchaser's obligations as if the signatory were the purchaser in the case of a default by a proprietary limited company purchaser.

3. GUARANTEE

The vendor may require one or more directors of the purchaser to guarantee the purchaser's performance of this contract if the purchaser is a proprietary limited company.

4. NOMINEE

The purchaser may no later than 14 days before the due date for settlement nominate a substitute or additional person to take a transfer of the land, but the named purchaser remains personally liable for the due performance of all the purchaser's obligations under this contract.

Title

5. ENCUMBRANCES

- 5.1 The purchaser buys the property subject to:
 - (a) any encumbrance shown in the section 32 statement other than mortgages or caveats; and
 - (b) any reservations, exceptions and conditions in the crown grant; and
 - (c) any lease or tenancy referred to in the particulars of sale.
- 5.2 The purchaser indemnifies the vendor against all obligations under any lease or tenancy that are to be performed by the landlord after settlement.

6. VENDOR WARRANTIES

- 6.1 The vendor warrants that these general conditions 1 to 35 are identical to the general conditions 1 to 35 in the form of contract of sale of land published by the Law Institute of Victoria Limited and the Real Estate Institute of Victoria Ltd in the month and year set out at the foot of this page.
- 6.2 The warranties in general conditions 6.3 and 6.4 replace the purchaser's right to make requisitions and inquiries.
- 6.3 The vendor warrants that the vendor:
 - (a) has, or by the due date for settlement will have, the right to sell the land; and
 - (b) is under no legal disability; and
 - (c) is in possession of the land, either personally or through a tenant; and
 - (d) has not previously sold or granted any option to purchase, agreed to a lease or granted a pre-emptive right which is current over the land and which gives another party rights which have priority over the interest of the purchaser; and
 - (e) will at settlement be the holder of an unencumbered estate in fee simple in the land; and
 - (f) will at settlement be the unencumbered owner of any improvements, fixtures, fittings and goods sold with the land.
- 6.4 The vendor further warrants that the vendor has no knowledge of any of the following:
 - (a) public rights of way over the land;
 - (b) easements over the land;
 - (c) lease or other possessory agreement affecting the land;
 - (d) notice or order directly and currently affecting the land which will not be dealt with at settlement, other than the usual rate notices and any land tax notices;
 - (e) legal proceedings which would render the sale of the land void or voidable or capable of being set aside.
- 6.5 The warranties in general conditions 6.3 and 6.4 are subject to any contrary provisions in this contract and disclosures in the section 32 statement.

- 6.6 If sections 137B and 137C of the Building Act 1993 apply to this contract, the vendor warrants that:
 - (a) all domestic building work carried out in relation to the construction by or on behalf of the vendor of the home was carried out in a proper and workmanlike manner; and
 - (b) all materials used in that domestic building work were good and suitable for the purpose for which they were used and that, unless otherwise stated in the contract, those materials were new; and
 - (c) domestic building work was carried out in accordance with all laws and legal requirements, including, without limiting the generality of this warranty, the *Building Act* 1993 and regulations made under the *Building Act* 1993.
- 6.7 Words and phrases used in general condition 6.6 which are defined in the *Building Act* 1993 have the same meaning in general condition 6.6.

7. IDENTITY OF THE LAND

- 7.1 An omission or mistake in the description of the property or any deficiency in the area, description or measurements of the land does not invalidate the sale.
- 7.2 The purchaser may not:
 - (a) make any objection or claim for compensation for any alleged misdescription of the property or any deficiency in its area or measurements; or
 - (b) require the vendor to amend title or pay any cost of amending title.

8. SERVICES

- 8.1 The vendor does not represent that the services are adequate for the purchaser's proposed use of the property and the vendor advises the purchaser to make appropriate inquiries. The condition of the services may change between the day of sale and settlement and the vendor does not promise that the services will be in the same condition at settlement as they were on the day of sale.
- 8.2 The purchaser is responsible for the connection of all services to the property after settlement and the payment of any associated cost.

9. CONSENTS

The vendor must obtain any necessary consent or licence required for the sale. The contract will be at an end and all money paid must be refunded if any necessary consent or licence is not obtained by settlement.

10. TRANSFER & DUTY

- 10.1 The purchaser must prepare and deliver to the vendor at least 7 days before the due date for settlement any paper transfer of land document which is necessary for this transaction. The delivery of the transfer of land document is not acceptance of title.
- 10.2 The vendor must promptly initiate the Duties on Line or other form required by the State Revenue Office in respect of this transaction, and both parties must co-operate to complete it as soon as practicable.

11. RELEASE OF SECURITY INTEREST

- 11.1 This general condition applies if any part of the property is subject to a security interest to which the *Personal Property Securities Act* 2009 (Cth) applies.
- 11.2 For the purposes of enabling the purchaser to search the Personal Property Securities Register for any security interests affecting any personal property for which the purchaser may be entitled to a release, statement, approval or correction in accordance with general condition 11.4, the purchaser may request the vendor to provide the vendor's date of birth to the purchaser. The vendor must comply with a request made by the purchaser under this condition if the purchaser makes the request at least 21 days before the due date for settlement.
- 11.3 If the purchaser is given the details of the vendor's date of birth under condition 11.2, the purchaser must-
 - (a) only use the vendor's date of birth for the purposes specified in condition 7.2; and
 - (b) keep the date of birth of the vendor secure and confidential.
- 11.4 The vendor must ensure that at or before settlement, the purchaser receives-
 - (a) a release from the secured party releasing the property from the security interest; or
 - (b) a statement in writing in accordance with section 275(1) (b) of the *Personal Property Securities Act* 2009 (Cth) setting out that the amount or obligation that is secured is nil at settlement; or
 - (c) a written approval or correction in accordance with section 275(1)(c) of the *Personal Property Securities Act* 2009 (Cth) indicating that, on settlement, the personal property included in the contract is not or will not be property in which the security interest is granted.
- security interest is granted.

 11.5 Subject to general condition 7.6, the vendor is not obliged to ensure that the purchaser receives a release, statement, approval or correction in respect of personal property-
 - (a) that-
 - (i) the purchaser intends to use predominantly for personal, domestic or household purposes; and
 - (ii) has a market value of not more than \$5000 or, if a greater amount has been prescribed for the purposes of section 47(1) of the *Personal Property Securities Act* 2009 (Cth), not more than that prescribed amount; or
 - (b) that is sold in the ordinary course of the vendor's business of selling personal property of that kind;

- 11.6 The vendor is obliged to ensure that the purchaser receives a release, statement, approval or correction in respect of personal property described in general condition 11.5 if-
 - the personal property is of a kind that may or must be described by serial number in the Personal Property Securities Register; or
 - (b) the purchaser has actual or constructive knowledge that the sale constitutes a breach of the security agreement that provides for the security interest.
- 11.7 A release for the purposes of general condition 11.4(a) must be in writing.
- 11.8 A release for the purposes of general condition 11.4(a) must be effective in releasing the goods from the security interest and be in a form which allows the purchaser to take title to the goods free of that security interest.
- 11.9 If the purchaser received a release under general condition 11.4(a) the purchaser must provide the vendor with a copy of the release at or as soon as practicable after settlement.
- 11.10 In addition to ensuring that a release is received under general condition 11.4(a), the vendor must ensure that at or before settlement the purchaser receives a written undertaking from a secured party to register a financing change statement to reflect that release if the property being released includes goods of a kind that are described by serial number in the Personal Property Securities Register.
- 11.11 The purchaser must advise the vendor of any security interest that is registered on or before the day of sale on the Personal Property Securities Register, which the purchaser reasonably requires to be released, at least 21 days before the due date for settlement.
- 11.12 The vendor may delay settlement until 21 days after the purchaser advises the vendor of the security interests that the purchaser reasonably requires to be released if the purchaser does not provide an advice under general condition 11.11.
- 11.13 If settlement is delayed under general condition 11.12 the purchaser must pay the vendor-
 - (a) interest from the due date for settlement until the date on which settlement occurs or 21 days after the vendor receives the advice, whichever is the earlier; and
 - (b) any reasonable costs incurred by the vendor as a result of the delayas though the purchaser was in default.
- 11.14 The vendor is not required to ensure that the purchaser receives a release in respect of the land. This general condition 7.14 applies despite general condition 7.1.
- 11.15 Words and phrases which are defined in the *Personal Property Securities Act* 2009 (Cth) have the same meaning in general condition 7 unless the context requires otherwise.

12. BUILDER WARRANTY INSURANCE

The vendor warrants that the vendor will provide at settlement details of any current builder warranty insurance in the vendor's possession relating to the property if requested in writing to do so at least 21 days before settlement.

13. GENERAL LAW LAND

- 13.1 The vendor must complete a conversion of title in accordance with section 14 of the *Transfer of Land Act* 1958 before settlement if the land is the subject of a provisional folio under section 23 of that Act.
- 13.2 The remaining provisions of this general condition 13 only apply if any part of the land is not under the operation of the *Transfer of Land Act* 1958.
- 13.3 The vendor is taken to be the holder of an unencumbered estate in fee simple in the land if there is an unbroken chain of title starting at least 30 years before the day of sale proving on the face of the documents the ownership of the entire legal and equitable estate without the aid of other evidence.
- 13.4 The purchaser is entitled to inspect the vendor's chain of title on request at such place in Victoria as the vendor nominates.
- 13.5 The purchaser is taken to have accepted the vendor's title if:
 - (a) 21 days have elapsed since the day of sale; and
 - (b) the purchaser has not reasonably objected to the title or reasonably required the vendor to remedy a defect in the title.
- 13.6 The contract will be at an end if:
 - (a) the vendor gives the purchaser a notice that the vendor is unable or unwilling to satisfy the purchaser's objection or requirement and that the contract will end if the objection or requirement is not withdrawn within 14 days of the giving of the notice; and
 - (b) the objection or requirement is not withdrawn in that time.
- 13.7 If the contract ends in accordance with general condition 13.6, the deposit must be returned to the purchaser and neither party has a claim against the other in damages.
- 13.8 General condition 17.1 [settlement] should be read as if the reference to 'registered proprietor' is a reference to 'owner' in respect of that part of the land which is not under the operation of the *Transfer of Land Act* 1958.

Money

14. DEPOSIT

- 14.1 The purchaser must pay the deposit:
 - (a) to the vendor's licensed estate agent; or
 - (b) if there is no estate agent, to the vendor's legal practitioner or conveyancer; or
 - (c) if the vendor directs, into a special purpose account in an authorised deposit-taking institution in Victoria specified by the vendor in the joint names of the purchaser and the vendor.
- 14.2 If the land sold is a lot on an unregistered plan of subdivision, the deposit:
 - (a) must not exceed 10% of the price; and
 - (b) must be paid to the vendor's estate agent, legal practitioner or conveyancer and held by the estate agent, legal practitioner or conveyancer on trust for the purchaser until the registration of the plan of subdivision.
- 14.3 The deposit must be released to the vendor if:
 - (a) the vendor provides particulars, to the satisfaction of the purchaser, that either-
 - (i) there are no debts secured against the property; or
 - (ii) if there are any debts, the total amount of those debts together with any amounts to be withheld in accordance with general conditions 24 and 25 does not exceed 80% of the sale price; and
 - (b) at least 28 days have elapsed since the particulars were given to the purchaser under paragraph (a); and
 - (c) all conditions of section 27 of the Sale of Land Act 1962 have been satisfied.
- 14.4 The stakeholder must pay the deposit and any interest to the party entitled when the deposit is released, the contract is settled, or the contract is ended.
- 14.5 The stakeholder may pay the deposit and any interest into court if it is reasonable to do so.
- 14.6 Where the purchaser is deemed by section 27(7) of the Sale of Land Act 1962 to have given the deposit release authorisation referred to in section 27(1), the purchaser is also deemed to have accepted title in the absence of any prior express objection to title
- 14.7 Payment of the deposit may be made or tendered:
 - (a) in cash up to \$1,000 or 0.2% of the price, whichever is greater; or
 - (b) by cheque drawn on an authorised deposit-taking institution; or
 - (c) by electronic funds transfer to a recipient having the appropriate facilities for receipt.

However, unless otherwise agreed:

- (d) payment may not be made by credit card, debit card or any other financial transfer system that allows for any chargeback or funds reversal other than for fraud or mistaken payment, and
- (e) any financial transfer or similar fees or deductions from the funds transferred, other than any fees charged by the recipient's a authorised deposit-taking institution, must be paid by the remitter.
- 14.8 Payment by electronic funds transfer is made when cleared funds are received in the recipient's bank account.
- 14.9 Before the funds are electronically transferred the intended recipient must be notified in writing and given sufficient particulars to readily identify the relevant transaction.
- 14.10 As soon as the funds have been electronically transferred the intended recipient must be provided with the relevant transaction number or reference details.
- 14.11 For the purpose of this general condition 'authorised deposit-taking institution' means a body corporate for which an authority under section 9(3) of the Banking Act 1959 (Cth) is in force.

15. DEPOSIT BOND

- 15.1 This general condition only applies if the applicable box in the particulars of sale is checked.
- 15.2 In this general condition "deposit bond" means an irrevocable undertaking to pay on demand an amount equal to the deposit or any unpaid part of the deposit. The issuer and the form of the deposit bond must be satisfactory to the vendor. The deposit bond must have an expiry date at least 45 days after the due date for settlement.
- 15.3 The purchaser may deliver a deposit bond to the vendor's estate agent, legal practitioner or conveyancer within 7 days after the day of sale.
- 15.4 The purchaser may at least 45 days before a current deposit bond expires deliver a replacement deposit bond on the same terms and conditions.
- 15.5 Where a deposit bond is delivered, the purchaser must pay the deposit to the vendor's legal practitioner or conveyancer on the first to occur of:
 - (a) settlement;
 - (b) the date that is 45 days before the deposit bond or any replacement deposit bond expires;
 - (c) the date on which this contract ends in accordance with general condition 35.2 [default not remedied] following breach by the purchaser; and
 - (d) the date on which the vendor ends this contract by accepting repudiation of it by the purchaser.
- 15.6 The vendor may claim on the deposit bond without prior notice if the purchaser defaults under this contract or repudiates this contract and the contract is ended. The amount paid by the issuer satisfies the obligations of the purchaser under general

- condition 15.5 to the extent of the payment.
- 15.7 Nothing in this general condition limits the rights of the vendor if the purchaser defaults under this contract or repudiates this contract, except as provided in general condition 15.6.
- 15.8 This general condition is subject to general condition 14.2 [deposit].

16. BANK GUARANTEE

- 16.1 This general condition only applies if the applicable box in the particulars of sale is checked.
- 16.2 In this general condition:
 - (a) "bank guarantee" means an unconditional and irrevocable guarantee or undertaking by a bank in a form satisfactory to the vendor to pay on demand any amount under this contract agreed in writing, and
 - (b) "bank" means an authorised deposit-taking institution under the Banking Act 1959 (Cth).
- 16.3 The purchaser may deliver a bank guarantee to the vendor's legal practitioner or conveyancer.
- 16.4 The purchaser must pay the amount secured by the bank guarantee to the vendor's legal practitioner or conveyancer on the first to occur of:
 - (a) settlement;
 - (b) the date that is 45 days before the bank guarantee expires;
 - (c) the date on which this contract ends in accordance with general condition 35.2 [default not remedied] following breach by the purchaser; and
 - (d) the date on which the vendor ends this contract by accepting repudiation of it by the purchaser.
- 16.5 The vendor must return the bank guarantee document to the purchaser when the purchaser pays the amount secured by the bank guarantee in accordance with general condition 16.4.
- 16.6 The vendor may claim on the bank guarantee without prior notice if the purchaser defaults under this contract or repudiates this contract and the contract is ended. The amount paid by the bank satisfies the obligations of the purchaser under general condition 16.4 to the extent of the payment.
- 16.7 Nothing in this general condition limits the rights of the vendor if the purchaser defaults under this contract or repudiates this contract except as provided in general condition 16.6.
- 16.8 This general condition is subject to general condition 14.2 [deposit].

17. SETTLEMENT

- 17.1 At settlement:
 - (a) the purchaser must pay the balance; and
 - (b) the vendor must:
 - (i) do all things necessary to enable the purchaser to become the registered proprietor of the land; and
 - (ii) give either vacant possession or receipt of rents and profits in accordance with the particulars of sale.
- 17.2 Settlement must be conducted between the hours of 10.00 am and 4.00 pm unless the parties agree otherwise.
- 17.3 The purchaser must pay all money other than the deposit in accordance with a written direction of the vendor or the vendor's legal practitioner or conveyancer.

18. ELECTRONIC SETTLEMENT

- 18.1 Settlement and lodgment of the instruments necessary to record the purchaser as registered proprietor of the land will be conducted electronically in accordance with the Electronic Conveyancing National Law. This general condition 18 has priority over any other provision of this contract to the extent of any inconsistency.
- 18.2 A party must immediately give written notice if that party reasonably believes that settlement and lodgment can no longer be conducted electronically. General condition 18 ceases to apply from when such a notice is given.
- 18.3 Each party must:
 - (a) be, or engage a representative who is, a subscriber for the purposes of the Electronic Conveyancing National Law,
 - (b) ensure that all other persons for whom that party is responsible and who are associated with this transaction are, or engage, a subscriber for the purposes of the Electronic Conveyancing National Law, and
 - (c) conduct the transaction in accordance with the Electronic Conveyancing National Law.
- 18.4 The vendor must open the electronic workspace ("workspace") as soon as reasonably practicable and nominate a date and time for settlement. The inclusion of a specific date and time for settlement in a workspace is not of itself a promise to settle on that date or at that time. The workspace is an electronic address for the service of notices and for written communications for the purposes of any electronic transactions legislation.
- 18.5 This general condition 18.5 applies if there is more than one electronic lodgment network operator in respect of the transaction. In this general condition 18.5 "the transaction" means this sale and purchase and any associated transaction involving any of the same subscribers.

To the extent that any interoperability rules governing the relationship between electronic lodgment network operators do not provide otherwise:

- (a) the electronic lodgement network operator to conduct all the financial and lodgment aspects of the transaction after the workspace locks must be one which is willing and able to conduct such aspects of the transaction in accordance with the instructions of all the subscribers in the workspaces of all the electronic lodgement network operators after the workspace locks;
- (b) if two or more electronic lodgement network operators meet that description, one may be selected by purchaser's incoming

mortgagee having the highest priority but if there is no mortgagee of the purchaser, the vendor must make the selection.

- 18.6 Settlement occurs when the workspace records that:
 - (a) there has been an exchange of funds or value between the exchange settlement account or accounts in the Reserve Bank of Australia of the relevant financial institutions or their financial settlement agents in accordance with the instructions of the parties; or
 - (b) if there is no exchange of funds or value, the documents necessary to enable the purchaser to become registered proprietor of the land have been accepted for electronic lodgment.
- 18.7 The parties must do everything reasonably necessary to effect settlement:
 - (a) electronically on the next business day, or
 - (b) at the option of either party, otherwise than electronically as soon as possible -

if, after the locking of the workspace at the nominated settlement time, settlement in accordance with general condition 18.6 has not occurred by 4.00 pm, or 6.00 pm if the nominated time for settlement is after 4.00 pm.

- 18.8 Each party must do everything reasonably necessary to assist the other party to trace and identify the recipient of any missing or mistaken payment and to recover the missing or mistaken payment
- 18.9 The vendor must before settlement:
 - (a) deliver any keys, security devices and codes ("keys") to the estate agent named in the contract,
 - (b) direct the estate agent to give the keys to the purchaser or the purchaser's nominee on notification of settlement by the vendor, the vendor's subscriber or the electronic lodgment network operator;
 - (c) deliver all other physical documents and items (other than the goods sold by the contract) to which the purchaser is entitled at settlement, and any keys if not delivered to the estate agent, to the vendor's subscriber or, if there is no vendor's s subscriber, confirm in writing to the purchaser that the vendor holds those documents, items and keys at the vendor's address set out in the contract, and

give, or direct its subscriber to give, all those documents and items and any such keys to the purchaser or the purchaser's nominee on notification by the electronic lodgment network operator of settlement.

19. GST

- 19.1 The purchaser does not have to pay the vendor any amount in respect of GST in addition to the price if the particulars of sale specify that the price includes GST (if any).
- 19.2 The purchaser must pay to the vendor any GST payable by the vendor in respect of a taxable supply made under this contract in addition to the price if:
 - (a) the particulars of sale specify that GST (if any) must be paid in addition to the price; or
 - (b) GST is payable solely as a result of any action taken or intended to be taken by the purchaser after the day of sale, including a change of use; or
 - (c) the particulars of sale specify that the supply made under this contract is of land on which a 'farming business' is carried on and the supply (or part of it) does not satisfy the requirements of section 38-480 of the GST Act; or
 - (d) the particulars of sale specify that the supply made under this contract is of a going concern and the supply (or a part of it) does not satisfy the requirements of section 38-325 of the GST Act.
- 19.3 The purchaser is not obliged to pay any GST under this contract until a tax invoice has been given to the purchaser.
- 19.4 If the particulars of sale specify that the supply made under this contract is of land on which a 'farming business' is carried on:
 - (a) the vendor warrants that the property is land on which a farming business has been carried on for the period of 5 years preceding the date of supply; and
 - (b) the purchaser warrants that the purchaser intends that a farming business will be carried on after settlement on the property.
- 19.5 If the particulars of sale specify that the supply made under this contract is a 'going concern':
 - (a) the parties agree that this contract is for the supply of a going concern; and
 - (b) the purchaser warrants that the purchaser is, or prior to settlement will be, registered for GST; and
 - (c) the vendor warrants that the vendor will carry on the going concern until the date of supply
- 19.6 If the particulars of sale specify that the supply made under this contract is a 'margin scheme' supply, the parties agree that the margin scheme applies to this contract.
- 19.7 In this general condition:
 - (a) 'GST Act' means A New Tax System (Goods and Services Tax) Act 1999 (Cth); and
 - (b) 'GST' includes penalties and interest.

20. LOAN

20.1 If the particulars of sale specify that this contract is subject to a loan being approved, this contract is subject to the lender approving the loan on the security of the property by the approval date or any later date allowed by the vendor.

- 20.2 The purchaser may end the contract if the loan is not approved by the approval date, but only if the purchaser:
 - (a) immediately applied for the loan; and
 - (b) did everything reasonably required to obtain approval of the loan; and
 - (c) serves written notice ending the contract, together with written evidence of rejection or non-approval of the loan, on the vendor within 2 clear business days after the approval date or any later date allowed by the vendor; and
 - (d) is not in default under any other condition of this contract when the notice is given.
- 20.3 All money must be immediately refunded to the purchaser if the contract is ended.

21. BUILDING REPORT

- 21.1 This general condition only applies if the applicable box in the particulars of sale is checked.
- 21.2 The purchaser may end this contract within 14 days from the day of sale if the purchaser:
 - (a) obtains a written report from a registered building practitioner or architect which discloses a current defect in a structure on the land and designates it as a major building defect;
 - (b) gives the vendor a copy of the report and a written notice ending this contract; and
 - (c) is not then in default.
- 21.3 All money paid must be immediately refunded to the purchaser if the contract ends in accordance with this general condition.
- 21.4 A notice under this general condition may be served on the vendor's legal practitioner, conveyancer or estate agent even if the estate agent's authority has formally expired at the time of service.
- 21.5 The registered building practitioner may inspect the property at any reasonable time for the purpose of preparing the report.

22. PEST REPORT

- 22.1 This general condition only applies if the applicable box in the particulars of sale is checked.
- 22.2 The purchaser may end this contract within 14 days from the day of sale if the purchaser:
 - (a) obtains a written report from a pest control operator licensed under Victorian law which discloses a current pest infestation on the land and designates it as a major infestation affecting the structure of a building on the land;
 - (b) gives the vendor a copy of the report and a written notice ending this contract; and
 - (c) is not then in default.
- 22.3 All money paid must be immediately refunded to the purchaser if the contract ends in accordance with this general condition.
- 22.4 A notice under this general condition may be served on the vendor's legal practitioner, conveyancer or estate agent even if the estate agent's authority has formally expired at the time of service.
- 22.5 The pest control operator may inspect the property at any reasonable time for the purpose of preparing the report.

23. ADJUSTMENTS

- 23.1 All periodic outgoings payable by the vendor, and any rent and other income received in respect of the property must be apportioned between the parties on the settlement date and any adjustments paid and received as appropriate.
- 23.2 The periodic outgoings and rent and other income must be apportioned on the following basis:
 - (a) the vendor is liable for the periodic outgoings and entitled to the rent and other income up to and including the day of settlement; and
 - (b) the land is treated as the only land of which the vendor is owner (as defined in the Land Tax Act 2005); and
 - (c) the vendor is taken to own the land as a resident Australian beneficial owner; and
 - (d) any personal statutory benefit available to each party is disregarded in calculating apportionment.
- 23.3 The purchaser must provide copies of all certificates and other information used to calculate the adjustments under general condition 23, if requested by the vendor.

24. FOREIGN RESIDENT CAPITAL GAINS WITHHOLDING

- 24.1 Words defined or used in Subdivision 14-D of Schedule 1 to the *Taxation Administration Act* 1953 (Cth) have the same meaning in this general condition unless the context requires otherwise.
- 24.2 Every vendor under this contract is a foreign resident for the purposes of this general condition unless the vendor gives the purchaser a clearance certificate issued by the Commissioner under section 14-220 (1) of Schedule 1 to the Taxation Administration Act 1953 (Cth). The specified period in the clearance certificate must include the actual date of settlement.
- 24.3 The remaining provisions of this general condition 24 only apply if the purchaser is required to pay the Commissioner an amount in accordance with section 14-200(3) or section 14-235 of Schedule 1 to the *Taxation Administration Act* 1953 (Cth) ("the amount") because one or more of the vendors is a foreign resident, the property has or will have a market value not less than the amount set out in section 14-215 of the legislation just after the transaction, and the transaction is not excluded under section 14-215(1) of the legislation.
- 24.4 The amount is to be deducted from the vendor's entitlement to the contract consideration. The vendor must pay to the purchaser at settlement such part of the amount as is represented by non-monetary consideration.

24.5 The purchaser must:

- (a) The engage a legal practitioner or conveyancer ("representative") to conduct all the legal aspects of settlement, including the performance of the purchaser's obligations under the legislation and this general condition; and
- (b) ensure that the representative does so.
- 24.6 The terms of the representative's engagement are taken to include instructions to have regard to the vendor's interests and instructions that the representative must:
 - pay, or ensure payment of, the amount to the Commissioner in the manner required by the Commissioner and as soon as reasonably and practicably possible, from moneys under the control or direction of the representative in accordance with this general condition if the sale of the property settles;
 - (b) promptly provide the vendor with proof of payment; and
 - (c) otherwise comply, or ensure compliance, with this general condition; despite:
 - (d) any contrary instructions, other than from both the purchaser and the vendor; and
 - (e) any other provision in this contract to the contrary.
- 24.7 The representative is taken to have complied with the requirements of general condition 24.6 if:
 - (a) the settlement is conducted through an electronic lodgment network; and
 - (b) the amount is included in the settlement statement requiring payment to the Commissioner in respect of this transaction
- 24.8 Any clearance certificate or document evidencing variation of the amount in accordance with section 14-235(2) of Schedule 1 to the Taxation Administration Act 1953 (Cth) must be given to the purchaser at least 5 business days before the due date for settlement.
- 24.9 The vendor must provide the purchaser with such information as the purchaser requires to comply with the purchaser's obligation to pay the amount in accordance with section 14-200 of Schedule 1 to the Taxation Administration Act 1953 (Cth). The information must be provided within 5 business days of request by the purchaser. The vendor warrants that the information the vendor provides is true and correct.
- 24.10 The purchaser is responsible for any penalties or interest payable to the Commissioner on account of late payment of the amount.

25. GST WITHHOLDING

- 25.1 Words and expressions defined or used in Subdivision 14-E of Schedule 1 to the *Taxation Administration Act 1953* (Cth) or in *A New Tax System (Goods and Services Tax) Act 1999* (Cth) have the same meaning in this general condition unless the context requires otherwise. Words and expressions first used in this general condition and shown in italics and marked with an asterisk are defined or described in at least one of those Acts.
- 25.2 The purchaser must notify the vendor in writing of the name of the recipient of the *supply for the purposes of section 14-255 of Schedule 1 to the *Taxation Administration Act 1953* (Cth) at least 21 days before the due date for settlement unless the recipient is the purchaser named in the contract.
- 25.3 The vendor must at least 14 days before the due date for settlement provide the purchaser and any person nominated by the purchaser under general condition 4 with a GST withholding notice in accordance with section 14-255 of Schedule 1 to the *Taxation Administration Act 1953* (Cth), and must provide all information required by the purchaser or any person so nominated to confirm the accuracy of the notice.
- 25.4 The remaining provisions of this general condition 25 apply if the purchaser is or may be required to pay the Commissioner an *amount in accordance with section 14-250 of Schedule 1 to the *Taxation Administration Act 1953* (Cth) because the property is *new residential premises or *potential residential land in either case falling within the parameters of that section, and also if the sale attracts the operation of section 14-255 of the legislation. Nothing in this general condition 25 is to be taken as relieving the vendor from compliance with section 14-255.
- 25.5 The amount is to be deducted from the vendor's entitlement to the contract *consideration and is then taken to be paid to the vendor, whether or not the vendor provides the purchaser with a GST withholding notice in accordance with section 14- 255 of Schedule 1 to the *Taxation Administration Act 1953* (Cth). The vendor must pay to the purchaser at settlement such part of the amount as is represented by non-monetary consideration.
- 25.6 The purchaser must:
 - (a) engage a legal practitioner or conveyancer ("representative") to conduct all the legal aspects of settlement, including the performance of the purchaser's obligations under the legislation and this general condition; and
 - (b) ensure that the representative does so.
- 25.7 The terms of the representative's engagement are taken to include instructions to have regard to the vendor's interests relating to the payment of the amount to the Commissioner and instructions that the representative must:
 - (a) pay, or ensure payment of, the amount to the Commissioner in the manner required by the Commissioner and as soon as reasonably and practicably possible, from moneys under the control or direction of the representative in accordance with this general condition on settlement of the sale of the property;
 - (b) promptly provide the vendor with evidence of payment, including any notification or other document provided by the purchaser to the Commissioner relating to payment; and
 - (c) otherwise comply, or ensure compliance, with this general condition; despite:
 - (d) any contrary instructions, other than from both the purchaser and the vendor; and

- (e) any other provision in this contract to the contrary.
- 25.8 The representative is taken to have complied with the requirements of general condition 25.7 if:
 - (a) settlement is conducted through an electronic lodgment network; and
 - (b) the amount is included in the settlement statement requiring payment to the Commissioner in respect of this transaction.
- 25.9 The purchaser may at settlement give the vendor a bank cheque for the amount in accordance with section 16-30 (3) of Schedule 1 to the *Taxation Administration Act 1953* (Cth), but only if:
 - (a) so agreed by the vendor in writing; and
 - (b) the settlement is not conducted through an electronic lodgment network.However, if the purchaser gives the bank cheque in accordance with this general condition 25.9, the vendor must:
 - (c) immediately after settlement provide the bank cheque to the Commissioner to pay the amount in relation to the supply; and
 - (d) give the purchaser a receipt for the bank cheque which identifies the transaction and includes particulars of the bank cheque, at the same time the purchaser gives the vendor the bank cheque.
- 25.10 A party must provide the other party with such information as the other party requires to:
 - (a) decide if an amount is required to be paid or the quantum of it, or
 - (b) comply with the purchaser's obligation to pay the amount,

in accordance with section 14-250 of Schedule 1 to the Taxation Administration Act 1953 (Cth). The information must be provided within 5 business days of a written request. The party providing the information warrants that it is true and correct.

- 25.11 The vendor warrants that:
 - (a) at settlement, the property is not new residential premises or potential residential land in either case falling within the parameters of section 14-250 of Schedule 1 to the *Taxation Administration Act 1953* (Cth) if the vendor gives the purchaser a written notice under section 14-255 to the effect that the purchaser will not be required to make a payment under section 14-250 in respect of the supply, or fails to give a written notice as required by and within the time specified in section 14-255; and
 - (b) the amount described in a written notice given by the vendor to the purchaser under section 14-255 of Schedule 1 to the *Taxation Administration Act 1953* (Cth) is the correct amount required to be paid under section 14-250 of the legislation
- 25.12 The purchaser is responsible for any penalties or interest payable to the Commissioner on account of non-payment or late payment of the amount, except to the extent that:
 - (a) the penalties or interest arise from any failure on the part of the vendor, including breach of a warranty in general condition 25.11; or
 - (b) the purchaser has a reasonable belief that the property is neither new residential premises nor potential residential land requiring the purchaser to pay an amount to the Commissioner in accordance with section 14-250 (1) of Schedule 1 to the *Taxation Administration Act 1953* (Cth).

The vendor is responsible for any penalties or interest payable to the Commissioner on account of non-payment or late payment of the amount if either exception applies.

Transactional

26. TIME & CO OPERATION

- 26.1 Time is of the essence of this contract.
- 26.2 Time is extended until the next business day if the time for performing any action falls on a day which is not a business day.
- 26.3 Each party must do all things reasonably necessary to enable this contract to proceed to settlement, and must act in a prompt and efficient manner.
- 26.4 Any unfulfilled obligation will not merge on settlement.

27. SERVICE

- 27.1 Any document required to be served by or on any party may be served by or on the legal practitioner or conveyancer for that party.
- 27.2 A cooling off notice under section 31 of the Sale of Land Act 1962 or a notice under general condition 20 [loan approval], 21 [building report] or 22 [pest report] may be served on the vendor's legal practitioner, conveyancer or estate agent even if the estate agent's authority has formally expired at the time of service.
- 27.3 A document is sufficiently served:
 - (a) personally, or
 - (b) by pre-paid post, or
 - (c) in any manner authorized by law or by the Supreme Court for service of documents, including any manner authorised for service on or by a legal practitioner, whether or not the person serving or receiving the document is a legal practitioner, or
 - (d) by email.

- 27.4 Any document properly sent by:
 - (a) express post is taken to have been served on the next business day after posting, unless proved otherwise;
 - (b) priority post is taken to have been served on the fourth business day after posting, unless proved otherwise;
 - (c) regular post is taken to have been served on the sixth business day after posting, unless proved otherwise;
 - (d) email is taken to have been served at the time of receipt within the meaning of section 13A of the Electronic *Transactions* (Victoria) Act 2000
- 27.5 In this contract 'document' includes 'demand' and 'notice', 'serve' includes 'give', and 'served' and 'service' have corresponding meanings.

28. NOTICES

- 28.1 The vendor is responsible for any notice, order, demand or levy imposing liability on the property that is issued or made before the day of sale, and does not relate to periodic outgoings.
- 28.1 The purchaser is responsible for any notice, order, demand or levy imposing liability on the property that is issued or made on or after the day of sale, and does not relate to periodic outgoings.
- 28.3 The purchaser may enter the property to comply with that responsibility where action is required before settlement.

29. INSPECTION

The purchaser and/or another person authorised by the purchaser may inspect the property at any reasonable time during the 7 days preceding and including the settlement day.

30. TERMS CONTRACT

31. LOSS OR DAMAGE BEFORE SETTLEMENT

32. BREACH

A party who breaches this contract must pay to the other party on demand:

- (a) compensation for any reasonably foreseeable loss to the other party resulting from the breach; and
- (b) any interest due under this contract as a result of the breach.

Default

33. INTEREST

Interest at a rate of 2% per annum plus the rate for the time being fixed by section 2 of the Penalty Interest Rates Act 1983 is payable at settlement on any money owing under the contract during the period of default, without affecting any other rights of the offended party.

34. DEFAULT NOTICE

- 34.1 A party is not entitled to exercise any rights arising from the other party's default, other than the right to receive interest and the right to sue for money owing, until the other party is given and fails to comply with a written default notice.
- 34.2 The default notice must:
 - (a) specify the particulars of the default; and
 - (b) state that it is the offended party's intention to exercise the rights arising from the default unless, within 14 days of the notice being given -
 - (i) the default is remedied; and
 - (ii) the reasonable costs incurred as a result of the default and any interest payable are paid.

35. DEFAULT NOT REMEDIED

- 35.1 All unpaid money under the contract becomes immediately payable to the vendor if the default has been made by the purchaser and is not remedied and the costs and interest are not paid.
- 35.2 The contract immediately ends if:
 - (a) the default notice also states that unless the default is remedied and the reasonable costs and interest are paid, the contract will be ended in accordance with this general condition; and
 - (b) the default is not remedied and the reasonable costs and interest are not paid by the end of the period of the default notice.
- 35.3 If the contract ends by a default notice given by the purchaser:

 - (ii) resell the property in any manner and recover any deficiency in the price on the resale and any resulting expenses by way of liquidated damages; and
 - (d) the vendor may retain any part of the price paid until the vendor's damages have been determined and may apply that money towards those damages; and
 - (e) any determination of the vendor's damages must take into account the amount forfeited to the vendor.

Due diligence checklist

What you need to know before buying a residential property

Before you buy a home, you should be aware of a range of issues that may affect that property and impose restrictions or obligations on you, if you buy it. This checklist aims to help you identify whether any of these issues will affect you. The questions are a starting point only and you may need to seek professional advice to answer some of them. Urban living

Moving to the inner city?

High density areas are attractive for their entertainment and service areas, but these activities create increased traffic as well as noise and odours from businesses and people. Familiarising yourself with the character of the area will give you a balanced understanding of what to expect.

Is the property subject to an owners corporation?

If the property is part of a subdivision with common property such as driveways or grounds, it may be subject to an owners corporation. You may be required to pay fees and follow rules that restrict what you can do on your property, such as a ban on pet ownership.

Growth areas

Are you moving to a growth area?

You should investigate whether you will be required to pay a growth areas infrastructure contribution.

Flood and fire risk

Does this property experience flooding or bushfire?

Properties are sometimes subject to the risk of fire and flooding due to their location. You should properly investigate these risks and consider their implications for land management, buildings and insurance premiums.





Rural properties

Moving to the country?

If you are looking at property in a rural zone, consider:

Is the surrounding land use compatible with your lifestyle expectations? Farming can create noise or odour that may be at odds with your expectations of a rural lifestyle.

Are you considering removing native vegetation? There are regulations which affect your ability to remove native vegetation on private property.

Do you understand your obligations to manage weeds and pest animals?

Can you build new dwellings?

Does the property adjoin crown land, have a water frontage, contain a disused government road, or are there any crown licences associated with the land?

Is there any earth resource activity such as mining in the area?

Soil and groundwater contamination

Has previous land use affected the soil or groundwater?

You should consider whether past activities, including the use of adjacent land, may have caused contamination at the site and whether this may prevent you from doing certain things to or on the land in the future.

Land boundaries

Do you know the exact boundary of the property?

You should compare the measurements shown on the title document with actual fences and buildings on the property, to make sure the boundaries match. If you have concerns about this, you can speak to your lawyer or conveyancer, or commission a site survey to establish property boundaries.





Planning controls

Can you change how the property is used, or the buildings on it?

All land is subject to a planning scheme, run by the local council. How the property is zoned and any overlays that may apply, will determine how the land can be used. This may restrict such things as whether you can build on vacant land or how you can alter or develop the land and its buildings over time.

The local council can give you advice about the planning scheme, as well as details of any other restrictions that may apply, such as design guidelines or bushfire safety design. There may also be restrictions – known as encumbrances – on the property's title, which prevent you from developing the property. You can find out about encumbrances by looking at the section 32 statement.

Are there any proposed or granted planning permits?

The local council can advise you if there are any proposed or issued planning permits for any properties close by. Significant developments in your area may change the local 'character' (predominant style of the area) and may increase noise or traffic near the property.

Safety

Is the building safe to live in?

Building laws are in place to ensure building safety. Professional building inspections can help you assess the property for electrical safety, possible illegal building work, adequate pool or spa fencing and the presence of asbestos, termites, or other potential hazards.

Building permits

Have any buildings or retaining walls on the property been altered, or do you plan to alter them?

There are laws and regulations about how buildings and retaining walls are constructed, which you may wish to investigate to ensure any completed or proposed building work is approved. The local council may be able to give you information about any building permits issued for recent building works done to the property, and what you must do to plan new work. You can also commission a private building surveyor's assessment.

Are any recent building or renovation works covered by insurance?

Ask the vendor if there is any owner-builder insurance or builder's warranty to cover defects in the work done to the property.





Utilities and essential services

Does the property have working connections for water, sewerage, electricity, gas, telephone and internet?

Unconnected services may not be available, or may incur a fee to connect. You may also need to choose from a range of suppliers for these services. This may be particularly important in rural areas where some services are not available.

Buyers' rights

Do you know your rights when buying a property?

The contract of sale and section 32 statement contain important information about the property, so you should request to see these and read them thoroughly. Many people engage a lawyer or conveyancer to help them understand the contracts and ensure the sale goes through correctly. If you intend to hire a professional, you should consider speaking to them before you commit to the sale. There are also important rules about the way private sales and auctions are conducted. These may include a cooling-off period and specific rights associated with 'off the plan' sales. The important thing to remember is that, as the buyer, you have rights.

- A. Council is the Planning Authority pursuant to the Act for the Amendment.
- B. The Owner is or is entitled to be the registered proprietor of the Subject Land.
- C. The Subject Land is part of the Epping North Growth Area and is to be developed for urban purposes generally in accordance with the Epping North Strategic Plan. The Amendment will among other things rezone the Subject Land to a Comprehensive Development Zone with an associated Schedule to facilitate the urban development of the Subject Land.
- D. Prior to the approval of the Amendment, the Owner of the Subject Land must enter into agreement with Council to address the provision of infrastructure and public open space.
- E. The parties enter into this Agreement to achieve and advance the objectives of planning in Victoria and in particular the objectives of the Planning Scheme in respect of the Subject Land.

THE PARTIES AGREE

1. **DEFINITIONS**

In this Agreement the words and expressions set out in this clause have the following meanings unless the context admits otherwise:

1st Oval means the sporting oval marked 'AS01' on Figure 4 of the Development Contributions Plan.

2nd Oval means the sporting oval shown in yellow within the site marked as 'P-12 school' on Figure 5 of the Development Contributions Plan.

3rd Oval means the sporting oval shown on Figure 4 of the Development Contributions Plan cross-hatched in green and directly adjacent to the 1st Oval.

Act means the Planning and Environment Act 1987.

Accommodation Units has the meaning given in section 6.10 of the Development Contributions Plan.

Actual Yield means the number of Accommodation Units constructed, or able to be constructed, within the part of the ADP2 Area which has been subdivided for urban purposes.

Additional Area means the land shown as areas A, B and C in Figure 6 of the Development Contributions Plan, Cotters Lane, Vearings Road and part of Harvest Home Road.

ADP2 Area means the area shown in Figure 2 of the Development Contributions Plan.

Agreement means this agreement and any agreement executed by the parties expressed to be supplemental to this agreement.

Amendment means Amendment C41 to the Planning Scheme.

Approval Date is the date on which a notice of approval of the Amendment is published in the Government Gazette.

Concept Plans means plans showing preliminary siting, layout, floor plans, perspectives, elevations and landscaping.

Conservation Purposes means a purpose including the conservation or the retention of any native vegetation, stony knoll or the like.

Construction Cost means the figure identified for a particular Infrastructure Project in Column 5 of Table 2 of the Development Contributions Plan plus, in respect of Infrastructure Projects identified in the Development Contributions Plan as 'Community Activity centres', the cost of providing up to an additional 10 car parking spaces if those parking spaces are shown on Working Drawings determined pursuant to clause 3.5.5 of this Agreement.

Contribution Portion means 31.96% of the Transport Corridor Land.

Development Contributions Plan means 'Aurora Development Plan 2 – Development Contributions' dated November 2007 and which is attached to this Agreement and marked with the letter "A" for identification but subject to amendments made pursuant to clause 4 of this Agreement.

Development Plan means a development plan approved by the Council pursuant to Schedule 23 to the Development Plan Overlay of the Planning Scheme.

Development Levy and **Development Levies** mean the amount or amounts determined in accordance with Table 5 of the Development Contributions Plan to be attributable to VicUrban.

Draft Development Plan means the document entitled *Aurora Development Plan: Part 2, June 2006* which was exhibited for information purposes with the Amendment.

Expected Yield means 18 Accommodation Units per hectare of the Net Developable Area of land which has been subdivided for urban purposes.

Infrastructure Project means any infrastructure project listed in the Development Contribution Plan.

Mortgagee means the person or persons registered or entitled from time to time to be registered by the Registrar of Titles as Mortgagee of the Subject Land or any part of it.



Net Developable Area has the same meaning as set out in the Development Contributions Plan.

New Lot means the following lot which will be created after the Approval Date:

 proposed Lot 6 on PS 608862E which is currently part of Lot 3 on PS 511685P and part of PC364273U.

Non-Road Projects means VicUrban Infrastructure Projects which are not Road Infrastructure Projects.

Open Space Land means unencumbered land to be set aside for active and passive open space purposes but does not include land which is required to or ought to be set aside for Conservation Purposes.

Owner means the person or persons registered or entitled from time to time to be registered by the Registrar of Titles as proprietor or proprietors of an estate in fee simple of the Subject Land or any part of it and includes a Mortgagee-in-possession.

party or parties means the Owner and Council under this Agreement as appropriate.

Planning Scheme means the Whittlesea Planning Scheme and any other planning scheme that applies to the Subject Land.

Plan of Subdivision means a plan of subdivision relating to the Subject Land which is not a procedural plan but a plan that upon registration creates an additional lot which can be disposed of separately and is intended to be used for a dwelling or which is intended to be re-subdivided.

Pro Rata Amount means Construction Cost x Actual Yield/Expected Yield

Project Land means any land which is required for an Infrastructure Project excluding the Open Space Land and the Transport Corridor Land.

Road Infrastructure Projects means VicUrban Infrastructure Projects which involve the construction of roads or intersections.

Rawlinsons means the latest available edition of Rawlinsons Australian Construction Handbook.

Shared Cost Projects means VicUrban Infrastructure Projects in respect of which only part of the total Construction Cost is attributed to VicUrban in Table 5 of the Development Contributions Plan.

Subject Land means the land referred to or described in the Certificate(s) of Title set out in Schedule 1 to this Agreement and any reference to the Subject Land in this Agreement includes any lot created by the subdivision of the Subject Land or any part of it.

Transport Corridor Land means land required for the Infrastructure Project identified in Table 2 of the Development Contributions Plan as PT01, which is shown illustratively as 'Transit Corridor' in Figure 3 of the Development Contributions Plan.

VicUrban means the Victorian Urban Development Authority constituted under the Victorian Urban Development Authority Act 2003

VicUrban Amount means, for a VicUrban Infrastructure Project, the amount identified in column 3 of Table 5.



VicUrban Infrastructure Projects means Infrastructure Projects identified in Table 5 of the Development Contributions Plan as attributable, or partly attributable, to VicUrban.

Working Drawings means detailed architectural design plans including detailed structural, electrical, hydrological, mechanical and landscaping plans.

2. INTERPRETATION

In this Agreement unless the context admits otherwise:

- 2.1 The singular includes the plural and vice versa.
- 2.2 A reference to a gender includes a reference to each other gender.
- A reference to a person includes a reference to a firm, corporation or other corporate body and that person's successors in law.
- 2.4 If a party consists of more than one person this Agreement binds them jointly and each of them severally.
- 2.5 A term used in this Agreement has its ordinary meaning unless that term is defined in this Agreement. If a term is not defined in this Agreement and it is defined in the Act it has the meaning as defined in the Act.
- 2.6 A reference to a clause is a reference to a clause in this Agreement.
- 2.7 A reference to a Schedule is a reference to a Schedule to this Agreement.
- 2.8 A reference to an Act, Regulation or the Planning Scheme includes any Acts, Regulations or amendments amending, consolidating or replacing the Act, Regulation or Planning Scheme.
- 2.9 The introductory clauses to this Agreement are and will be deemed to form part of this Agreement.
- 2.10 The obligations of the Owner under this Agreement, will take effect as separate and several covenants which are annexed to and run at law and equity with the Subject Land provided that if the Subject Land is subdivided, this Agreement must be read and applied so that each subsequent owner of a lot is only responsible for those covenants and obligations which relate to that owner's lot.

3. **DEVELOPMENT CONTRIBUTIONS**

The Owner and Council covenant and agree that:

3.1 Development Contributions

- 3.1.1 The Owner shall make development contributions to Council, to the value of the Development Levy, in respect each part of the Subject Land subdivided or developed for urban purposes. For the avoidance of doubt, where development contributions have been made upon the subdivision of any part of the Subject Land, no further contributions shall be made upon the development of that part of the Subject Land.

- in respect of Non-Road Projects, construction and delivery of projects in accordance with clause 3.5.2 or, if clause 3.5.7 applies, cash payments in accordance with clause 3.5.7.
- 3.1.3 the value of each development contribution identified in clause 3.1.2 shall be determined for the purposes of clause 3.1.1, in accordance with Table 5 of the Development Contributions Plan.

3.2 Open Space Land and Project Land transfers

- 3.2.1 the Owner must transfer to or vest in Council the amount of unencumbered Open Space Land (passive and active) specified in columns 11 and 12 of Table 4 of the Development Contributions Plan in respect of the Subject Land;
- 3.2.2 the location and distribution of the area of the active unencumbered Open Space Land specified in Table 4 of the Development Contributions Plan to be transferred to or vested in Council must be:

 - 3.2.2.2 in accordance with section 4.2 of the Development Contributions Plan; and
 - 3.2.2.3 generally in accordance with Figure 4 of the Development Contributions Plan;
- 3.2.3 the location and distribution of the area of the passive unencumbered. Open Space Land specified in Table 4 of the Development Contributions. Plan to be transferred to or vested in Council must be consistent with the objectives and standards set out in clause 56 of the Planning Scheme;
- 3.2.4 if the Owner and Council agree that, to accord with the provisions of clause 56.05-2 of the Planning Scheme in relation to small parks, land should be provided for open space purposes which is additional to that specified in Table 4 of the Development Contributions Plan, the Owner will not be entitled to any credit or payment under this Agreement in respect of that additional land;
- 3.2.5 subject to this Agreement, the Owner must at a time specified in this Agreement, transfer to or vest in Council the Project Land;
- 3.2.6 any Project Land must be transferred to or vested in Council at such time that:



- 3.2.6.1 the land is sought to be subdivided; or
- at a time that approximately accords with the time set out in the Development Contributions Plan for the carrying out of the Infrastructure Project; and/or if there is no time specified
- 3.2.6.3 when Council advises the Owner in writing either as a condition of a planning permit or otherwise that the Project Land must be transferred to or vested in Council -

whichever is the earliest.

- 3.2.7 subject to clause 4, this Agreement fixes land values for Open Space Land and Project Land for the purposes of determining the land cost of any Infrastructure Project and paying compensation to the Owner in respect of any land required for any Infrastructure Project and for the purposes of giving effect to this Agreement, Council may to the extent that it is necessary to do so, impose on any relevant planning permit a condition providing that no compensation is payable under Part 5 of the Act in respect of anything done under the permit or setting out
 - 3.2.7.1 the circumstances in which compensation will be paid for anything done under the permit; and
 - 3.2.7.2 the amount, or the method of determining the amount, of compensation payable;

3.3 Transport Corridor land

- 3.3.1 subject to this Agreement, the Owner must transfer to, or vest in, the Department of Infrastructure the Contribution Portion of the Transport Corridor Land at such time as the Department of Infrastructure advises the Owner in writing that the Transport Corridor Land is required.
- 3.3.2 the Council and the Owner acknowledge:
 - that the balance of the Transport Corridor Land will be acquired by the Department of Infrastructure by way of a separate agreement between the Owner and the Department of Infrastructure;
 - 3.3.2.2 that the determination of appropriate compensation or consideration to be paid by the Department of Infrastructure for the acquisition of the balance of the Transport Corridor Land will also be the subject of the separate agreement between the Owner and the Department of Infrastructure.

3.4 Road Infrastructure Projects

3.4.1 the Owner shall construct and deliver the Road Infrastructure Projects in accordance with the times specified in column 10 of Table 5 of the Development Contributions Plan or at such other time as may be agreed in writing with Council having regard to the staging of the development.



3.5 Non-Road Projects

- 3.5.1 Non-Road Projects will, unless clause 3.5.7 applies, be provided by the Owner by way of construction and delivery of the Non-Road Project;
- 3.5.2 the Non-Road Projects delivered by the Owner shall:
 - 3.5.2.1 be delivered in accordance with the triggers specified in column 3 of Table 3 of the Development Contributions Plan;
 - 3.5.2.2 be consistent with the project description contained in column 3 of Table 2 of the Development Contributions Plan;
 - 3.5.2.3 subject to clause 3.5.8 contain the components listed in Schedule 3;
 - 3.5.2.4 accord with the Working Drawings determined pursuant to the design process contained in clauses 3.5.3 to 3.5.5 of this Agreement;
- 3.5.3 a design brief for each Non-Road Project shall be determined as follows:
 - 3.5.3.1 The Owner shall prepare a draft design brief for submission to Council;
 - 3.5.3.2 Council may provide to the Owner any comments it has in relation to the draft design brief, within 14 days of the date of its submission by the Owner;
 - 3.5.3.3 The Owner shall, having regard to any comments made by Council pursuant to clause 3.5:3.2 of this Agreement, prepare a final design brief for the Non-Road Project;
- 3.5.4 Concept Plans for each Non-Road Project shall be determined as follows:
 - 3.5.4.1 The Owner shall prepare Concept Plans for submission to the Council:
 - 3.5.4.2 Council may provide to the Owner any comments it has in relation to the Concept Plans, within 14 days of the date of their submission by the Owner;
 - 3.5.4.3 The Owner shall, having regard to any comments made by the Council pursuant to clause 3.5.4.2, prepare final Concept Plans for the Non-Road Project;
- 3.5.5 Working Drawings for each Non-Road Projects shall be determined as follows:
 - 3.5.5.1. The Owner shall engage an appropriately qualified professional to prepare Working Drawings for the Non-Road Project, in accordance with the Concept Plans prepared in accordance with clause 3.5.4;
 - 3.5.5.2. The Owner shall produce Working Drawings which demonstrate, to the satisfaction of the Council, that the Non-Road Project shall be fit for the purpose for which it is intended;
 - 3.5.5.3. Council shall, by the later of the following times, give notice to the Owner in relation to whether the Working Drawings are to the Council's satisfaction:



- (a) 28 days from the date upon which the Working Drawings are submitted by the Owner; or
- (b) 7 days from the date of the first Ordinary Meeting of Council which is at least 14 days from the date upon which the Working Drawings are submitted by the Owner; and
- 3.5.5.4 If Council does not give notice within the time specified in clause 3.5.5.3, the Working Drawings shall be taken to be to the Council's satisfaction;
- 3.5.6 The Owner shall call for tenders for the construction of the Non-Road Project in accordance with the Working Drawings determined pursuant to clause 3.5.5 of this Agreement, and:
 - 3.5.5.1. if the Owner receives a tender for the construction of the Non-Road Project for a cost which is no greater than the Construction Cost for that project the Owner shall cause the Non-Road Project to be constructed and delivered in accordance with the Working Drawings determined pursuant to clause 3.5.5; or
 - 3.5.5.2. if the Owner does not receive a tender for the construction of the Non-Road Project at a cost which is no greater that the Construction Cost for that project the Owner may elect to either:
 - (a) review the design of the Non-Road Project through the submission of amended Working Drawings pursuant to clause 3.5.5 of this Agreement; or
 - (b) construct and deliver the Non-Road Project in accordance with the Working Drawings determined pursuant to clause 3.5.5.
- 3.5.7 If the trigger point for a Non-Road Project listed in Table 3 of the development Contributions Plan will not be reached, the development contribution in respect of that project shall be in the form of a cash payment calculated in accordance with the Pro Rata Amount.
- 3.5.8 The Owner agrees that:
 - 3.5.5.3. in the course of the preparation of the working drawings under clause 3.5.5 of this Agreement, it shall retain a competent traffic engineer to advise whether each Community Activity Centre as identified in the Development Contributions Plan should be provided with up to an additional 10 car parking spaces,
 - 3.5.5.4. if the traffic engineer considers that up to 10 additional car parking spaces should be provided, the working drawings must include those additional car parking spaces.

. REVIEW OF DEVELOPMENT CONTRIBUTIONS PLAN

The parties agree that:

4.1 Adjustment of costs

4.1.1 On 1 July 2008 the Development Contributions Plan shall be reviewed so that the costings within the Development Contributions Plan which are current as at November 2005 are adjusted so as to be made current to 1



July 2008 and for that purpose the adjustment index shall be derived from the Rawlinsons Australian Construction Handbooks current between November 2005 and 1 July 2008.

4.1.2 On 1 July 2009 and on each year thereafter the Development Contributions Plan shall be reviewed to adjust construction costs either upwards or downwards by reference to an index derived from Rawlinsons.

4.2 Review of Development Contributions Plan

- 4.2.1 Every fifth year from the Approval Date Council shall, in consultation with VicUrban, review the Development Contributions Plan, including in relation to the costing detail of Infrastructure Projects, the triggers for the delivery of Infrastructure Projects, the sequencing of the delivery of Infrastructure Projects and the continued necessity for Infrastructure Projects;
- 4.2.2 Council may, following a review undertaken pursuant to clause 4.2.1 of this Agreement, propose an amendment to the Development Contributions Plan;
- 4.2.3 The Development Contributions Plan may be amended only with the written agreement of both Council and VicUrban.

5. OTHER SPECIFIC OBLIGATIONS OF VICURBAN

- VicUrban agrees that notwithstanding the sale of the Subject Land or part thereof to a 3rd party, VicUrban will remain responsible for and must deliver each of the Infrastructure Projects that are located entirely within the Subject Land or that part of the Subject Land and that VicUrban must make and put in place any private contractual arrangements necessary between itself and the 3rd party that is required to give full effect to this obligation.
- VicUrban will, in respect of any development contributions delivered pursuant to this Agreement, keep proper records and accounts in accordance with its obligations.
- 5.3 VicUrban agrees that, if it becomes the owner in fee simple of any part of the Additional Area:
 - VicUrban will notify Council's planning department of that drawing attention to this obligation in this Agreement;
 - 5.3.2 the part of the Additional Area owned by VicUrban will become part of the Subject Land for the purposes of this Agreement;
 - 5.3.3 VicUrban will consent to Council making application to the Registrar of Titles to make a recording of this Agreement in the Register on the Certificate of Title of the part of the Additional Area owned by VicUrban in accordance with section 181 of the Act.
- VicUrban agrees that when the New Lot has been created and VicUrban has become the owner in fee simple of the New Lot:



- 5.4.1 VicUrban will notify Council's planning department of that drawing attention to this obligation in this Agreement;
- 5.4.2 the New Lot owned by VicUrban will become part of the Subject Land for the purposes of this Agreement;
- 5.4.3 VicUrban will consent to Council making application to the Registrar of Titles to make a recording of this Agreement in the Register on the Certificate of Title of the New Lot owned by VicUrban in accordance with section 181 of the Act.
- VicUrban agrees that if, after using its best endeavours, Council is unable to reach an agreement with the Department of Education and Early Childhood Development under clause 6.7 of this Agreement:
 - 5.5.1 VicUrban shall provide land for the 3rd Oval which shall, in combination with the 1st Oval be 7.2ha in area, or such lesser amount as may be agreed between the Council and VicUrban;
 - 5.5.2 if the 3rd Oval is provided and impacts on the land available for a Community Activity Centre, VicUrban must also offset the loss of land for the Community Activity Centre by providing sufficient replacement land or space within a building for the Community Activity Centre to Council's satisfaction;
 - 5.5.3 the land provided under clause 5.5.2 will not be offset against any other public open space land or obligations in this Agreement.

6. SPECIFIC OBLIGATIONS OF COUNCIL CONCERNING THE DEVELOPMENT CONTRIBUTIONS

Council agrees that:

- 6.1 it will, in respect of any development contributions received pursuant to this Agreement, keep proper records and accounts in accordance with its obligations under the *Local Government Act* 1989;
- it will apply the Development Levies received pursuant to this Agreement for the purposes described in this Agreement;
- it will deal with the funds received pursuant to this Agreement on the same basis as it deals with funds received under an Approved Development Contributions Plan;
- it will utilise any cash contributions received pursuant to clause 3.5.7, within a reasonable time, to provide alternative infrastructure projects in the ADP2 Area;
- the provisions of section 46Q of the Act apply with such adjustments as are necessary in the context of this Agreement;
- 6.6 in respect of each Shared Cost Project, it will pay to the Owner the difference between the Construction Cost and the VicUrban Amount:
 - 6.6.1.1 within 14 days of the Owner providing Council with a tax invoice for its proportion of any progress payment due under a contract in respect of that Shared Cost Project; or



- at such other time as may be agreed between the parties in writing;
- 6.7 it will negotiate in good faith with the Department of Education and Early Childhood Development and use its best endeavours to secure a joint use agreement in terms which are acceptable to Council regarding the use of the 2nd Oval.

7. FURTHER OBLIGATIONS OF THE OWNER

7.1 Notice and Registration

The Owner further covenants and agrees that the Owner will bring this Agreement to the attention of all prospective purchasers, lessees, mortgagees, chargees, transferees and assigns.

7.2 Further actions

The Owner further covenants and agrees that:

- 7.2.1 the Owner will do all things necessary to give effect to this Agreement;
- 7.2.2 the Owner will consent to Council making application to the Registrar of Titles to make a recording of this Agreement in the Register on the Certificate of Title of the Subject Land in accordance with Section 181 of the Act and do all things necessary to enable Council to do so including signing any further agreement, acknowledgment or document or procuring the consent to this Agreement of any mortgagee or caveator to enable the recording to be made in the Register under that section.

7.3 Council's Costs to be Paid

The Owner further covenants and agrees that the Owner will immediately pay to Council, Council's reasonable costs and expenses (including legal expenses) of and incidental to the preparation, drafting, finalisation, engrossment, execution, registration and enforcement of this Agreement to a maximum of \$12,000 which are and until paid will remain a debt due to Council by the Owner.

8. AGREEMENT UNDER SECTION 173 OF THE ACT

Council and the Owner agree that without limiting or restricting the respective powers to enter into this Agreement and, insofar as it can be so treated, this Agreement is made as a Deed pursuant to Section 173 of the Act, and the obligations of the Owner under this Agreement are obligations to be performed by the Owner as conditions subject to which the Subject Land may be used and developed for specified purposes.

9. OWNER'S WARRANTIES

Without limiting the operation or effect which this Agreement has, the Owner warrants that apart from the Owner and any other person who has consented in writing to this Agreement, no other person has any interest, either legal or equitable, in the Subject Land which may be affected by this Agreement.



10. SUCCESSORS IN TITLE

Without limiting the operation or effect that this Agreement has, the Owner must ensure that, until such time as a memorandum of this Agreement is registered on the title to the Subject Land, successors in title shall be required to:

- give effect to and do all acts and sign all documents which will require those successors to give effect to this Agreement; and
- execute a deed agreeing to be bound by the terms of this Agreement.

11. GENERAL MATTERS

11.1 Notices

A notice or other communication required or permitted to be served by a party on another party must be in writing and may be served:

- 11.1.1 by delivering it personally to that party;
- by sending it by prepaid post addressed to that party at the address set out in this Agreement or subsequently notified to each party from time to time; or
- 11.1.3 by sending it by facsimile provided that a communication sent by facsimile shall be confirmed immediately in writing by the sending party by hand delivery or prepaid post.

11.2 Service of Notice

A notice or other communication is deemed served:

- 11.2.1 if delivered, on the next following business day;
- 11.2.2 if posted, on the expiration of 7 business days after the date of posting; or
- if sent by facsimile, on the next following business day unless the receiving party has requested retransmission before the end of that business day.

11.3 No Waiver

Any time or other indulgence granted by Council to the Owner or any variation of the terms and conditions of this Agreement or any judgment or order obtained by Council against the Owner will not in any way amount to a waiver of any of the rights or remedies of Council in relation to the terms of this Agreement.

11.4 Severability

If a court, arbitrator, tribunal or other competent authority determines that a word, phrase, sentence, paragraph or clause of this Agreement is unenforceable, illegal or void then it must be severed and the other provisions of this Agreement will remain operative.



11.5 No Fettering of Council's Powers

It is acknowledged and agreed that this Agreement does not fetter or restrict the power or discretion of Council to make any decision or impose any requirements or conditions in connection with the granting of any planning approval or certification of any plans of subdivision applicable to the Subject Land or relating to any use or development of the Subject Land.

11.6 Penalty for late payment

Any amount due under this Agreement but unpaid by the due date shall incur interest at the rate prescribed under section 172 of the *Local Government Act* 1989 and any payment made shall be first directed to payment of interest and then the principal amount owing;

11.7 Lower order infrastructure

The development contributions which this Agreement provides for only relate to higher order infrastructure which are envisaged to be used by a broad cross section of the community and do not relate to the lower order infrastructure items described in Schedule 2 which must be provided by the Owner as part of the urban development of the Subject Land.

12. GOODS AND SERVICES TAX

- In this clause words that are defined in A New Tax System (Goods and Services Tax) Act 1999 have the same meaning as their definition in that Act.
- 12.2 Except as otherwise provided by this clause, all consideration payable under this Agreement in relation to any supply is exclusive of GST.
- 12.3 If GST is payable in respect of any supply made by a supplier under this Agreement, subject to clause 12.4 the recipient will pay to the supplier an amount equal to the GST payable on the supply at the same time and in the same manner as the consideration for the supply is to be provided under this Agreement.
- 12.4 The supplier must provide a tax invoice to the recipient before the supplier will be entitled to payment of the GST payable under clause 12.3.

13. COMMENCEMENT OF AGREEMENT

Unless otherwise provided in this Agreement, this Agreement commences from the Approval Date.

14. ENDING OF AGREEMENT

14.1 This Agreement ends:

- 14.1.1 when the Owner has complied with all of the obligations imposed on the Owner under this Agreement and both Council and the Owner agree that the Agreement can be removed from the title to the Subject Land; or
- 14.1.2 if Council has not, within 12 months of the date of this Agreement, approved a Development Plan which is substantially in accordance with the Draft Development Plan.



- 14.2 If any part of the Subject Land is subdivided the Council and the Owner may agree that this Agreement is no longer required in relation to one or more particular allotments shown on the Plan of Subdivision and that:
 - 14.2.1 the Agreement will end in relation to that allotment; and
 - 14.2.2 a recording of the Agreement is not required to be registered on any subsequent certificate of title generated for that allotment.
- As soon as reasonably practicable after the Agreement has ended, Council will, at the request and at the cost of the Owner make application to the Registrar of Titles under Section 183(2) of the Act to cancel the recording of this Agreement on the register.





GENERAL

In these conditions the terms,

- (a) 'You' and 'Your' refer to the owner of a property connected (or about to be connected) to Yarra Valley Water assets
- (b) 'We', 'Us' and 'Our' refer to Yarra Valley Water.

Section 145 of the Water Act 1989 details the legislative rights and responsibilities of both the applicant and Yarra Valley Water in relation to connection, alteration or removal and discharging to the works of Yarra Valley Water. These Conditions of Connection set out the terms and conditions to be satisfied for connecting a property to sewer, potable and recycled water.

These conditions are binding on successor-in-title of the person who applied for that consent, under section 145 of the Water Act 1989. If you are not the owner of the property, please provide a copy of this letter to the owner.

The Conditions of Connection must be handed to the Licensed Plumber. Any work which these Conditions of Connection require you to undertake, must be done by a Licensed Plumber, engaged by you, at your cost.

It is the Licensed Plumber's responsibility to ensure that the plumbing and drainage work is completed in accordance with the relevant plumbing regulations and to the satisfaction of the Victorian Building Authority – Plumbing.

Any sewer connection branch and the connecting works must be installed so that they comply, in all respects, with the:

- Plumbing Regulations 1998 (Vic);
- Water Industry Regulations 2006 (Vic);
- Building Act 1993 (Vic);
- Relevant AS/NZS series of standards applicable to sewer connection branch and connecting works from time to time,

and any other technical requirements which we reasonably specify.

It is the responsibility of the person performing any excavation in a road reserve to obtain a Road Opening Permit from the relevant Authority before any excavation work commences. All traffic management requirements contained in the permit must be complied with.

WATER

General water supply(s) are to be installed as referenced in the table of approval details of this document as required services. The table includes water main and connection details. In a mandated recycled water area recycling connections also apply and are referenced in the same table.

For 20mm and 25mm services and all services where a manifold is to be installed, the service pipe, including a meter assembly with a temporary spacer pipe and any relevant backflow device must be

result in the tapping contractor to the time of the tapping or meter installation. Meters are installed by Yarra Valley Waters plumbing contractor. For 32mm and larger services, the meter will be delivered to you and must be installed on the property prior to the tapping. The service pipe must also be installed prior to the tapping. All manifolds are to be located below ground and must be left exposed for Yarra Valley Water's plumbing contractor to inspect prior to installation of the meters. Failure to comply will result in the tapping being cancelled. A rebooking fee will be applicable when rebooking the tapping.

All tappings, pluggings and metering products can be arranged using easyACCESS. Work must be carried out in accordance with the Water Metering & Servicing Guidelines (see our website). Once all fees have been paid and you are ready to book your plumbing products, please contact Yarra Valley Waters contractor Mondo on 1300 735 328. A phone call is not required if products are New Estate Connections or Combo Drinking Water & Recycled Water. Please allow a minimum of 10 business days' notice when contacting Mondo.

All meters are supplied by Yarra Valley Water after payment of the relevant fees.

If the tapping and/or plugging is required to be performed outside of business hours, either at your request or as determined by Yarra Valley Water's plumbing contractor, an additional after hours fee will apply.

Meters are not permitted to be installed inside units/dwellings. In all situations where the meter is deemed inaccessible, either by your advice, or as determined by Yarra Valley Water plumbing contractor, remote read meters must be fitted at your cost. Remote read meters must be installed in the following circumstances: high rise developments; any water meter which is located where Yarra Valley Water will have to enter a building to read the meter; where access to the meter will be restricted by gates/fences. If you are aware that remote read meters will be required, please inform the easyACCESS staff at the time of booking.

For all tappings and/or pluggings, it is the responsibility of the person performing the excavation to obtain a Road Opening Permit from the local municipal authority before any excavation work commences. All traffic management requirements contained in the Road Opening permit must be complied with. The excavation must expose the main at the tapping/plugging point and be made safe prior to the tapping / plugging appointment time. If you choose to have Yarra Valley Waters plumbing contractor carry out the excavation, Yarra Valley Water will organize the necessary permit at an additional cost on a per road opening basis.

Failure to comply with any of these requirements will result in the booking being cancelled and a rebooking fee will apply.

Whether you have elected your plumber or Yarra Valley Water to carry out the excavation, please contact Yarra Valley Waters Plumbing Contractor Mondo on 1300 735 328 to schedule a date and time. Prior to our Plumbing Contractor attending on site to carry out the scheduled work you will be required to clearly mark your preferred location for the service. If the preferred location is not marked, the work will not be undertaken and you will incur a wasted site visit fee. Please note; bookings can take up to three (3) business days to generate after payment is made.

Should you wish to reschedule the booking, Yarra Valley Water's plumbing contractor can be contacted on 1300 735 328. If you cancel or reschedule a booking within 24 hours of the scheduled date / time a wasted site visit fee will apply. If you wish to cancel the booking you will need to contact Yarra Valley Water (if applicable), to seek a refund. A cancellation fee may apply.

METER ASSEMBLIES & POSITIONING

It is the responsibility of the private plumber to ensure that containment, zone and individual backflow prevention is provided.

Water meter assemblies:

- a) Must be within 2 metres of the title boundary that abuts the water main
- b) Must be fitted at right angles to the water main, in line with the tapping
- c) Must be fully supported with minimum ground clearance of 150mm and should not be >300mm from the finished ground level to the base of the assembly
- d) Must not be encased in concrete surrounds
- e) Must be readily accessible for reading, maintenance and replacement. If Yarra Valley Water deem meters to be inaccessible, remote meters may be required at additional cost to the customer
- f) Can be installed in utility rooms or meter cabinets located within a common access area and must be readily accessible, subject to Yarra Valley Water's approval

If meters need to be moved >600mm a plugging and re-tapping must be booked and the relevant fee paid.

Meters which are in a public space such as a reserve or school must be protected by an appropriate cage to prevent tampering.

Meters are not permitted to be installed in pits unless prior approval has been given by Yarra Valley Water.

Meter assemblies must adhere to the meter installation diagrams available on the Yarra Valley Water website (www.yvw.com.au) to ensure the installations meet the required standard.

REMOVAL OF WATER METERS

Only Yarra Valley Water's plumbing contractor is permitted to remove water meters.

If redevelopment of the site is occurring and the meter is no longer required, a plugging of the service must be arranged and the meter will be collected by our contractor at the time of the plugging.

DAMAGED OR STOLEN METERS

If the builder/plumber damage a meter or meter assembly, it is the responsibility of the builder/plumber to rectify these assets back to the same condition as at time of installation by Yarra Valley Water.

- Failure to do so will result in Yarra Valley Water making the necessary amendments and recovering these costs from the property owner.
- Repeat offences may result in the services being plugged and re-booking fees will apply to have the services reinstated

Stolen meters are to be reported to Yarra Valley Water faults and emergencies:

- Call **13 2762** (24 hrs).
- Replacement of stolen meters can take up to 10 days. If replacement is required more
 urgently, please advise the operator at the time of the call.
- Until the meter is replaced no connections between the supply and the dwelling are to be reinstated. No straight pieces or alternative connections are allowed to be installed.

Subdivisions will not be issued with Statement of Compliance until these recycled water conditions and any other conditions imposed by YVW have been met.

These conditions are issued under Section 145 of the *Water Act 1989* ("the Act") and are applicable to properties supplied with Class A recycled water. These conditions are additional to any other conditions issued in relation to water supply and sewerage works. **Penalties apply under** the Act for breaches of these conditions.

Recycled Water Supply

In addition to the drinking water supply, this property must be connected to the Class A recycled water supply system.

Until Class A recycled water becomes available in the recycled water pipes, the property will be supplied with drinking water only. Drinking water will be supplied through both the drinking water and the Class A recycled water systems.

Residents will be advised prior to the Class A recycled water supply becoming available.

1. Breaching these Conditions

- 1.1. Yarra Valley Water may undertake follow up action under *the Act* for observed non-compliance to these conditions. Action may include:
 - (a) Serving a Notice to the applicant or property owner under Sections 150/151 of the Act. If a Notice if not complied with Yarra Valley Water will carry out any works and take any other action necessary to remedy the contravention and recover reasonable costs from the person on whom the Notice was served
 - (b) Discontinuation of supply without notice under Section 168 of the Act
 - (c) Escalation to relevant authorities including the Victorian Building Authority (VBA)

2. Class A Recycled Water Agreement and Environment Improvement Plan (EIP) - Non-Residential only

- 2.1. For non-residential properties where Class A recycled water is available, upon:
 - (a) connection of the property to the Class A recycled water supply system; or
 - (b) change in the intended use of Class A recycled water at the property; and/or
 - (c) change in the user (either property owner or tenant) of Class A recycled water at the property

the property owner must:

- (i) advise Yarra Valley Water of the intended use and the name of the user of Class A recycled water at the property to enable a risk assessment to be completed for approval of the use of Class A recycled water at the property; and
- where required by Yarra Valley Water, ensure the user of Class A recycled water at the property submits an EIP to Yarra Valley Water's satisfaction and enters into a Class A Recycled Water Agreement with Yarra Valley Water.

In the case of section 2.1(a), the requirements in section 2.1 must be met prior to Class A recycled water being connected to the property. In the case of section 2.1(b) and/or 2.1(c), Yarra Valley Water may cease supply of Class A recycled water to the property until the conditions of section 2.1 are met.

3. Recycled Water Plumbing

3.1. Toilet cisterns

- (a) Residential
 - (i) All toilet cisterns (excluding bidets) must be connected to the Class A Recycled Water Supply.
 - (ii) Toilets with an integrated bidet **are not** to be connected to the Class A Recycled Water Supply.

(b) Non-Residential

- (i) All toilet cisterns (excluding bidets) must be connected to the Class A Recycled Water Supply unless YVW has otherwise received and approved an application to the contrary.
- (ii) Toilets with an integrated bidet **are not** to be connected to the Class A Recycled Water Supply.

3.2. Rainwater Tanks

- (a) Rainwater tanks may be used for outdoor taps, irrigation systems and flushing of toilets.
- (b) Backup supply to the rainwater tank is only to be provided via an automatic changeover device connected to the Class A recycled water supply. All pipework must be appropriately marked as "Recycled or Reclaimed Water Do Not Drink" and taps must comply with the recycled water plumbing requirements.

3.3. External Taps – Residential

- (a) An external recycled water tap must be installed to service the **front** of the property:
 - Yarra Valley Water supplies a purple recycled water riser and tap with removable tap handle and signage at the time of the tapping for single residential lots/houses. The tap can be relocated by the private plumber if required but not removed.

 <u>Under no circumstances are the meters to be moved.</u>
 - (ii) The private plumber is required to fit the front purple recycled water tap with removable tap handle and signage for each unit in a single level residential unit development, or for the common property in a multi-level residential unit development.
 - (iii) Taps must be located to service the front external area of the property by use of a garden hose and must not be obstructed by any permanent fixture such as a fence or wall.
- (b) An external recycled water tap must be installed to service the rear of the property:

- (i) Taps to be located to service the rear external area of the property by use of a garden hose and must not be obstructed by any permanent fixture such as a fence or wall
- (ii) For single level unit developments, rear taps are to be installed per unit, or for the common property in a multi-level unit development.
- (c) All external recycled water taps must have the following features:
 - (i) The whole body of the tap and handle must be coloured purple
 - (ii) Tap to be the jumper valve type
 - (iii) Tap handle must be the removable type
 - (iv) Standard thread on tap outlet for garden hose bib
 - (v) Tap inlet to have 5/8" right hand thread
- (d) An external drinking water tap must installed to service the **front** of the property
 - (i) Yarra Valley Water supplies a drinking water riser and tap with atmospheric vacuum breaker at the time of the tapping for single residential lots/houses. The tap can be relocated by the private plumber if required but not removed. **Under no circumstances are the meters to be moved.**
 - (ii) The private plumber is required to fit the front drinking water tap with atmospheric vacuum breaker for each unit in a single level residential unit development, or for the common property in a multi-level residential unit development.
 - (iii) Taps must be located to service the front external area of the property by use of a garden hose and must not be obstructed by any permanent fixture such as a fence or wall.
- (e) All external drinking water supply taps must be fitted with atmospheric vacuum breakers.
- (f) Where prior approval has been sought to install meters in pits, it is the responsibility of the private plumber to provide front taps for the drinking and Class A recycled water supplies.

3.4. External Taps - Non-Residential

(a) External recycled water taps may be installed to service the front and/or rear areas of the property.

- (b) All external recycled water taps must comply with the features detailed in section 3.3(c).
- (c) All external recycled water taps at the property must be fitted with a keyed tap lock or be installed in a secure location where the property is partially or wholly one of the following:
 - (i) an educational site including but not limited to schools and kindergartens;
 - (ii) a site to which the public have access;
 - (iii) a health care centre; or
 - (iv) a site that is likely to have children present.
- (d) At least one external drinking water tap must be provided to service the property.
- (e) All external drinking water supply taps must be fitted with atmospheric vacuum breakers.

3.5. Laundry Use

- (a) A recycled water washing machine tap must be installed in the laundry.
- (b) All recycled water washing machine tap kits must have the following features:
 - (i) For horizontal tap installations: recycled water washing machine tap to be installed on the right side of the cold water tap (hot, cold & then recycled water from left to right).
 - (ii) For vertical tap installations: recycled water washing machine tap to be installed beneath the cold water tap (hot, cold & then recycled water from top to bottom).
 - (iii) 5/8" Female threaded tap complete with purple handle and standard 3/4" outlet
 - (iv) 5/8" Male lugged elbow
 - (v) Cover Plate with laser etched regulatory prohibition hybrid sign complying with AS1319 stating "Recycled Water Do Not Drink"

3.6. Irrigation Systems

- (a) Irrigation systems connected to recycled water must be fitted with an approved master solenoid valve to ensure that main lines up to individual sprinkler station solenoid valves are not under constant pressure. The master solenoid should be located close to the meter assembly to reduce the length of pressurized irrigation piping.
- (b) An appropriate containment backflow prevention device is to be fitted and independently

tested.

(c) You must ensure that recycled water runoff from the property to the stormwater is prevented.

3.7. Regulatory Prohibition Hybrid Signs

(a) A recycled water regulatory prohibition hybrid sign with the words "Recycled Water Do Not Drink" and complying with AS1319 is to be installed within 150mm of each external recycled water tap outlet, above the tap.

- 4.2. Properties which YVW require the site occupier to be on a Recycled Water Agreement are subject to the uses approved by YVW as stated in their Recycled Water Agreement.

5. Plumbing Standards

- 5.1. All recycled water plumbing works are to be carried out in accordance with:
 - (a) AS/NZS 3500
 - (b) Water Metering & Servicing Guidelines (Water Authorities). A copy of these guidelines are available by visiting www.yvw.com.au
 - (c) EPA Dual pipe water recycling schemes health and environmental risk management (guidelines for environmental management)

6. Inspections For Recycled Water Plumbing Works

6.1. The plumber is required to register and book inspections via Yarra Valley Water's online booking system (www.yvw.com.au/rwinspection). Inspections are mandatory and required at the stages below:

(a) R1 – All below ground pipework prior to backfilling

- (i) For Houses and High Rise developments an R1 inspection must be done from the main meter to the building
- (ii) For Multi-Unit developments an R1 inspection must be done for the internal main between the main meter and the check meters. R1 inspections are then required for each unit from the check meter to each dwelling
- (iii) For larger, more complex developments multiple R1 inspections may be required to inspect all the below ground pipework in stages
- (iv) Irrigation Systems require inspection of all below ground pipework

(b) R2 – All internal pipework prior to plastering

(i) For High-Rise developments separate R2 inspections must be booked for the common pipework on each floor servicing each dwelling

(c) R3– Commissioning prior to occupancy

- (i) The site must have passed the R1 and R2 inspections before the R3 can be done
- (ii) All tap-ware and plumbing fixtures must be fitted and operational
- (iii) Properties must not be occupied before passing the R3 inspection

(iv) Irrigation systems must be commissioned prior to lodgement of the Compliance Certificate

- 6.2. The deadline for booking R1 and R2 inspections is 3pm Monday to Friday
- 6.3. R3 inspections require two (2) business days' notice of the required inspection date
- 6.4. Inspections will take place Monday to Friday only. Inspections are not available on weekends or public holidays. Inspection times are 7.30am to 3pm.
- 6.5. R1 and R2 inspections can be booked consecutively for the same booking date only if they are both ready for inspection
- 6.6. R2 inspections can only be booked on metered properties or where a test bucket has been used to pressurise the pipework
- 6.7. For R3 inspections the plumber will be contacted by the next business day to confirm the inspection time
- 6.8. Safe access to the site must be provided for inspections to take place
- 6.9. Failure to book inspections will result in penalties. Refer Section 1.
- 6.10. A PIC Consent Number is required for every property/residence being booked for inspections. Contact Yarra Valley Water if you do not have a PIC number for every property/residence being inspected:
 - (a) For unit developments a Stage 1 (R1) inspection is also required from the main meter to the check meters, therefore a PIC Consent Number is also required for the main to check inspection.
- 6.11. Straight bridging pieces where a meter is missing are not acceptable due to the risk of backflow contamination:
 - (a) Properties using a straight piece will not pass these inspections.
- 6.12. Yarra Valley Water will only carry out the required inspections in so far as they relate to the Conditions of Connection issued for new developments connecting to recycled water. Inspections will be carried out in accordance with the EPA Guidelines and a Risk Based Approach. Yarra Valley Water will not be certifying or approving plumbing works in terms of quality and will not be liable for any poor workmanship carried out by the plumber.

7. Temporary Cross Connections

- 7.1. Where pressure testing of pipework installed for the provision of Class A Recycled Water requires a temporary interconnection with the drinking water supply plumbing, such interconnection is to be above ground and clearly visible.
- 7.2. This interconnection is to be removed by the private plumber at the time of the commissioning inspection.

8. Tappings

- 8.1. The drinking water property service pipe is to be PE pipe and must be water marked.
- 8.2. The Class A Recycled Water property service pipe is to be solid jacketed purple PE pipe and must be water marked:
 - (a) PE pipe must not form any part of the water meter assembly.
- **8.3.** In the case of short side installations the recycled water service pipe is to be laid on the left of the drinking water property service pipe (when facing the property) and maintain 300mm separation.
- **8.4.** In the case of long side installations the same conduit for the drinking water property service may be utilised for the recycled water, however the 300mm separation is to be maintained on both the upstream and downstream ends of the conduit.

9. Locking Device

- 9.1. All recycled water meters will be installed with a locking device at the time of the tapping.
- 9.2. The locking device can only be removed by Yarra Valley Water when the property is commissioned, passing the R3 inspection:
 - (a) If the locking device is removed prior to commissioning, this will be considered a breach of these Conditions and Section 288 of *the Act*. The locking device will be re-fitted and follow up will occur under *the Act*.

10. Meter Assemblies & Positioning

- 10.1. Recycled water meters are to be positioned to the left of the drinking water meter assembly.
- 10.2. Recycled water meters and the meter assembly including inlet and outlet pipework must be purple.

10.3. Meters in recycled water areas can only be moved by Yarra Valley Water.

- (a) An application must be made online via easyACCESS to move the meter/s.
- (b) Yarra Valley Water can move meters up to 600mm from their original tapping location:
 - (i) 20mm and 25mm meters are moved for free
 - (ii) 32mm and above incur costs
- (c) Meters which need to be moved >600mm need to be plugged and re-tapped and the relevant fees paid.
- (d) Any meters which have been illegally moved are in breach of these Conditions and Section 288 of *the* Act. Yarra Valley Water will take the necessary action required to rectify the meters and recover any costs in doing so from the applicant or property owner as required. Rectification may include disconnection of services, relocating meters back to their original position, or if this is not possible plugging and re-tapping to a new location.
- 10.4. Meters which are in a public space such as a reserve or school must be protected by an appropriate cage to prevent tampering.
- 10.5. Meters are not permitted to be installed in pits unless prior approval has been given by Yarra Valley Water.
- 10.6. Any 25mm installation must be fitted with a right-angle ball valve.
- 10.7. Minimum separation between meters as follows:
 - (a) 20mm to 25mm meters 250mm minimum clearance between meters
 - (b) 32mm and above 150mm minimum clearance between meters
 - (c) For recycled and potable meters minimum 300mm minimum clearance between the recycled and potable meters

11. Stolen Meters

11.1. Until the meter is replaced no connections between the supply and the dwelling are to be reinstated at the property. No straight pieces or alternative connections are allowed to be installed unless fitted by Yarra Valley Water's maintenance contractor.

11.2. Stolen meters must be reported by calling Yarra Valley Water on 1300 304 688.

12. Owner's Responsibility



14 Electrical safety activities

- (a) The rental provider must ensure an electrical safety check of all electrical installations, appliances and fittings provided by a rental provider in the rented premises is conducted every 2 years by a licensed or registered electrician and must provide the renter with the date of the most recent safety check, in writing, on request of the renter.
- (b) If an electrical safety check of the rented premises has not been conducted within the last two years at the time the renter occupies the premises, the rental provider must arrange an electrical safety check as soon as practicable.

15 Gas safety activities

This safety-related activity only applies if the rented premises contains any appliances, fixtures or fittings which use or supply gas.

- (a) The rental provider must ensure that a gas safety check of all gas installations and fittings in the rented premises is conducted every 2 years by a licensed or registered gasfitter and must provide the renter with the date of the most recent safety check, in writing, on request of the renter.
- (b) If a gas safety check has not been conducted within the last two years at the time the renter occupies the premises, the rental provider must arrange a gas safety check as soon as practicable.

16 Smoke alarm safety activities

- (a) The rental provider must ensure that:
 - i. any smoke alarm is correctly installed and in working condition; and
 - ii. any smoke alarm is tested according to the manufacturer's instructions at least once every 12 months, and
 - iii. the batteries in each smoke alarm are replaced as required.
- (b) The rental provider must immediately arrange for a smoke alarm to be repaired or replaced as an urgent repair if they are notified by the renter that it is not in working order.
 - Note: Repair or replacement of a hard-wired smoke alarm must be undertaken by a suitably qualified person.
- (c) The rental provider, on or before the occupation date, must provide the renter with the following information in writing:
 - i. information about how each smoke alarm in the rented premises operates;
 - ii. information about how to test each smoke alarm in the rented premises;
 - iii. information about the renter's obligations to not tamper with any smoke alarms and to report if a smoke alarm in the rented premises is not in working order.
- (d) The renter must give written notice to the rental provider as soon as practicable after becoming aware that a smoke alarm in the rented premises is not in working order.

Note: Regulations made under the **Building Act 1993** require smoke alarms to be installed in all residential buildings.

17 Swimming pool barrier safety activities

These safety-related activities only apply if the rented premises contains a swimming pool.

(a) The rental provider must ensure that the swimming pool barrier is maintained in good repair.

- (b) The renter must give written notice to the rental provider as soon as practicable after becoming aware that the swimming pool barrier is not in working order.
- (c) The rental provider must arrange for a swimming pool barrier to be immediately repaired or replaced as an urgent repair if they are notified by the renter that it is not in working order.
- (d) The rental provider must provide the renter with a copy of the most recent certificate of swimming pool barrier compliance issued under the **Building Act 1993** on the request of the renter.

18 Relocatable pool safety activities

These safety-related activities only apply if a relocatable swimming pool is erected, or is intended to be erected, on the rented premises.

- (a) The renter must not erect a relocatable swimming pool without giving written notice to the rental provider before erecting the pool.
- (b) The renter must obtain any necessary approvals before erecting a relocatable swimming pool.

Note: Regulations made under **Building Act 1993** apply to any person erecting a relocatable swimming pool. This safety-related activity only applies to swimming pools or spas that hold water deeper than 300 mm.

19 Bushfire prone area activities

This safety-related activity only applies if the rented premises is in a bushfire prone area and is required to have a water tank for bushfire safety.

If the rented premises is in a designated bushfire prone area under section 192A of the **Building Act 1993** and a water tank is required for firefighting purposes, the rental provider must ensure the water tank and any connected infrastructure is maintained in good repair as required.

The water tank must be full and clean at the commencement of the agreement.

Part D – Rights and obligations

This is a summary of selected rights and obligations of renters and rental providers under the Act.

Any reference to VCAT refers to the Victorian Civil and Administrative Tribunal.

20. Use of the premises

The renter:

- is entitled to guiet enjoyment of the premises. The rental provider may only enter the premises in accordance with the Act; and
- must not use the premises for illegal purposes; and
- must not cause a nuisance or interfere with the reasonable peace, comfort or privacy of neighbours; and
- must avoid damaging the premises and common areas. Common areas include hallways, driveways, gardens and stairwells. Where damage occurs, the renter must notify the rental provider in writing; and
- · must keep the premises reasonably clean.

21. Condition of the premises The rental provider:

- · must ensure that the premises comply with the rental minimum standards, and is vacant and reasonably clean when the renter moves in; and
- must maintain the premises in good repair and in a fit condition for occupation; and
- agrees to do all the safety-related maintenance and repair activities set out in Part C of the agreement.

The renter:

· The renter must follow all safety-related activities set out in Part C of the agreement and not remove, deactivate or otherwise interfere with the operation of prescribed safety devices on the premises.

22. Modifications

The renter:

- may make some modifications without seeking the rental provider's consent. These modifications are listed on the Consumer Affairs Victoria website; and
- other fixtures or additions; and
- may apply to VCAT if they believe that the rental provider has unreasonably refused consent for a modification mentioned in the Act; and
- at the end of the agreement, must restore the premises to the condition it was in before they moved in (excluding fair wear and tear). This includes removing all modifications, unless the parties agree they do not need to be removed.

The rental provider:

must not unreasonably refuse consent for certain modifications.

A list of the modifications that the rental provider cannot unreasonably refuse consent for is available on the Consumer Affairs Victoria website consumer.vic.gov.au/renting.

23. Locks

- The rental provider must ensure the premises has:
 - o locks to secure all windows capable of having a lock,
 - has deadlocks (a deadlock is a deadlatch with at least one cylinder) for external doors that are able to be secured with a functioning deadlock; and
 - o meets the rental minimum standards for locks and window locks.
- External doors which are not able to be secured with a functioning deadlock must at least be fitted with a locking device that
 - o is operated by a key from the outside; and
 - o may be unlocked from the inside with or without a
- The renter must obtain consent from the rental provider to change a lock in the master key system.
- The rental provider must not unreasonably refuse consent for a renter seeking to change a lock in the master key system.
- The rental provider must not give a key to a person excluded from the premises under a:
 - o a family violence intervention order; or
 - o a family violence safety notice; or
 - o a recognised non-local DVO; or
 - personal safety intervention order.

24. Repairs

· Only a suitably qualified person may do repairs—both urgent and non-urgent

25. Urgent repairs

Section 3(1) of the Act defines urgent repairs. Refer to the Consumer Affairs Victoria website for the full list of urgent repairs and for more information, visit consumer.vic.gov.au/urgentrepairs.

must seek the rental provider's consent before installing any Urgent repairs include failure or breakdown of any essential service or appliance provided for hot water, cooking, heating or laundering supplied by the rental provider.

> The rental provider must carry out urgent repairs after being notified. A renter may arrange for urgent repairs to be done if the renter has taken reasonable steps to arrange for the rental provider to immediately do the repairs and the rental provider has not carried out the repairs.

> If the renter has arranged for urgent repairs, the renter may be reimbursed directly by the rental provider for the reasonable cost of repairs up to \$2500.

The renter may apply to VCAT for an order requiring the rental provider to carry out urgent repairs if-

- (a) the renter cannot meet the cost of the repairs; or
- (b) the cost of repairs is more than \$2500; or
- (c) the rental provider refuses to pay the cost of repairs if it is carried out by the renter.

26. Non-urgent repairs

- The renter must notify the rental provider, in writing, as soon as practicable of
 - o damage to the premises; and
 - a breakdown of facilities, fixtures, furniture or equipment supplied by the rental provider.
- The rental provider must carry out non-urgent repairs in reasonable time.
- The renter may apply to VCAT for an order requiring the rental provider to do the repairs if the rental provider has not carried out the repairs within 14 days of receiving notice of the need for repair.

27. Assignment or sub-letting

The renter:

 The renter must not assign (transfer to another person) or sub-let the whole or any part of the premises without the written consent of the rental provider. The rental provider may give the renter notice to vacate if the renter assigns or sub-lets the premises without consent.

The rental provider:

- cannot unreasonably withhold consent to assign or sub-let the premises; and
- must not demand or receive a fee or payment for consent, other than any reasonable expenses incurred by the assignment.

28. Rent

- The rental provider must give the renter at least 60 days written notice of a proposed rent increase
- Rent cannot be increased more than once every 12 months.
- If the rental provider or agent does not provide a receipt for rent, then renter may request a receipt.
- The rental provider must not increase the rent under a fixed term agreement unless the agreement provides for an increase by specifying the amount of increase or the method of calculating the rent increase.

29. Access and entry

- The rental provider may enter the premises—
 - at any time, if the renter has agreed within the last 7 days; and
 - to do an inspection, but not more than once every 6 months; and
 - to comply with the rental provider's duties under the Act; and
 - to show the premises or conduct an open inspection to sell, rent or value the premises; and
 - to take images or video for advertising a property that is for sale or rent; and
 - if they believe the renter has failed to follow their duties under the Act; and
 - to do a pre-termination inspection where the renter has applied to have the agreement terminated because of family violence or personal violence.
- The renter must allow entry to the premises where the rental provider has followed proper procedure.
- The renter is entitled to a set amount of compensation for each sales inspection.

30. Pets

- The renter must seek consent from the rental provider before keeping a pet on the premises.
- The rental provider must not unreasonably refuse a request to keep a pet.

31. Additional terms (if any)

List any additional terms to this agreement. The terms listed must not exclude, restrict or modify any of the rights and duties included in the Act.

Additional terms must also comply with the Australian Consumer Law (Victoria). For example, they cannot be unfair terms, which will have no effect. 32. Damage to the Premises

The Renter must ensure that care is taken to avoid damaging the rented Premises.

The renter must take reasonable care to avoid damaging any common areas.

The Renter who becomes aware of damage to the rented Premises must give notice to the Rental provider of any damage to the Premises as soon as practicable.

33. Cleanliness of the Premises

33.1 The Renter must keep the Premises in a reasonably clean condition during the period of the Agreement.

34. Agent is First Point of Contact

34.1 The Renter acknowledges that it is not permitted to contact the Rental provider directly unless expressly authorised in writing. For the avoidance of doubt, the Renter acknowledges that where the Rental provider's consent is required to be obtained under this Agreement, the Renter is to direct such request for the Rental provider's consent to the Agent in writing. The Renter is to direct all queries or complaints to the Agent directly.

35. Water Consumption & Utilities

- 35.1 The Renter is responsible for all water usage charges where the property is separately metered. It is the Renter's obligation to establish the water usage account with the relevant body prior to taking occupation of the premises.
- 35.2 If a service is disconnected or damaged:
- a. due to the fault of the Rental provider, Agent or Rental provider's contractor, the Rental provider or Agent will have the service reconnected or repaired; or
- b. due to the fault of the Renter, or a person the Renter has on the Premises, the Renter must have the service re-connected or repaired at its cost.
- 35.3 If the Renter disconnects a service or changes the supplier of it, the Renter must pay the cost of having the service disconnected, another service connected or both. If the Premises is separately metered for utility services, the Renter must pay all charges in respect of the re-connection and consumption of water, gas, electricity and telephone.
- 35.4 The connection of an existing and/or new phone line, internet connection and/or connection of any cable television, antenna or dish or adding additional power outlets, phone sockets or antenna points will require the Rental provider's prior approval and will be at the Renter's cost.

36. Condition Report

- 36.1 If the Renter has not physically viewed the Premises, the Renter acknowledges that it has had a representative view the Premises on their behalf and agrees to accept the Premises as is.
- 36.2 The Renter acknowledges that before it took occupation of the Premises, it received from the Rental provider or Agent:

- a. An electronic copy of the condition report signed by the Rental provider or Agent.
- b. a written guide authorised and published by the Victorian Government entitled 'Renting a home: A guide for renters'; and
- c. a copy of this tenancy Agreement.

36.3 the Renter acknowledges that the condition report must be signed and returned to the Agent within 5 business days after taking possession of the Premises. If the condition report is not returned, the copy held by the Agent will be accepted as conclusive evidence of the state of repair or general condition of the Premises, as at the commencement of this Lease.

36.4 If the Renter is entering into a renewed Lease agreement, the original condition report will remain as true and correct.

37. Rental provider's Insurance and Renter's Contents Insurance

- 37.1 The Renter shall not do or allow anything to be done which would invalidate any insurance policy on the Premises or increase the premium and the Renter shall pay the Rental provider all increased premiums and all other expenses incurred as a consequence of any breach of this term.
- 37.2 The Renter agrees to pay the Rental provider any excess amount or additional premium charged by the Rental provider's insurance company (to the extent the Rental provider elects to have this insurance in place and use it for the Renter's responsible damage), as a result of any damage caused by the Renter, or by anyone on the Premises with the consent of the Renter.
- 37.3 The Rental provider's insurance policy covers only the building plus any fixtures and fittings at their option and not the Renter's contents. The Rental provider accepts no responsibility for stolen, misplaced or damaged personal belonging kept inside or outside the rented Premises whatsoever, including but not limited to items stored in vehicles in common car parking areas or storage cages. It is strongly recommended that the Renter obtains adequate insurance coverage for its possessions.

38. Reporting Defects

- 38.1 If the Renter becomes aware of a defect at the Premises that may injure someone or cause damage or which may otherwise give rise to a liability, it must notify the Agent as soon as possible and within 24 hours of becoming aware of such defect.
- 38.2 If the Renter becomes aware of any blockage of the drainage, septic or sewerage it must notify the Agent within 24 hours. If the Renter or anyone it allowed onto the Premises, caused a blockage or defect, the Renter will be responsible to pay to the Rental provider the reasonable expenses incurred in having the defect rectified.

39. Inspections

- 39.1 The Renter acknowledges and understands that after being in possession of the Premises for three months, a routine inspection will be conducted. Thereafter, routine inspections can be conducted every 6 months throughout the duration of the tenancy.
- 39.2 The Renter acknowledges and agrees that the Agent may conduct regular routine inspections with or without the presence of the Renter upon giving the Renter a minimum of 7 days' written notice.

Disclosure of information

- 40.1 The Renter authorises the Agent to disclose details of its credit worthiness, to the Renter's personal referees, employer, any record, listing or database of defaults by renters to the owner or agent of any future residence.
- 40.2 If the Renter defaults under this Agreement, the agent may disclose details of any such default to any person whom the agent reasonably considers has an interest receiving such information.

41. Employment Details

30.1 The Renter agrees to notify the agent of any change of employment to that set out in the original Tenancy Application.

42. Permitted Use

- 42.1 The Renter must use the Premises for the permitted use, which is as the Renter's place of residence. The Renter must not use the Premises for any other purpose without first obtaining the Rental provider's consent in writing, by sending a written request to the Agent.
- 42.2 The Renter shall not do or allow to be done anything that will cause the shared service facilities (if any) to become obstructed, untidy, damaged, or used for any purpose other than for which they are intended.
- 42.3 Any fines, infringements and penalty notices pertaining to the Premises, will be the responsibility of the Renter and the Renter agrees to deduct, from any monies paid to the Agent, the full amount of such fines or infringement, even if that would cause the Renter to then become in arrears.

43. Urgent and Non-Urgent Repairs

- 43.1 The Renter acknowledges that all non-urgent repairs and maintenance requests must be submitted in writing to the Agent via email to the contact details specified in Item 3 in the Schedule or to the nominated Agent's Representative.
- 43.2 The Renter agrees to immediately notify the Agent of any URGENT repairs, as per the contact details specified in Item 3. The Renter agrees to take all reasonable measures to get in contact with the Agent.
- 43.3 The Rental provider and the Renter acknowledge that the Agent is entitled to authorise urgent repairs to the maximum amount written under Urgent Repairs of Part D. The Rental provider will be contacted for approval for all urgent repairs prior to proceeding.
- 43.4 The Renter acknowledges that if a contractor is called out to the Premises with no repair required, then the Renter may be liable for payment of the invoice issued by the contractor.

44. Garden and Parking

- 44.1 The Renter agrees to maintain the garden and lawn unless agreed otherwise in writing. This includes weeding garden beds, pruning and maintenance of plants and bushes, mowing and edging of lawns and removal of any debris and leaves and generally keeping it neat and tidy.
- 44.2 The Renter must water the garden and lawn in accordance with the water restrictions. If there is an automatic watering system in place, the Renter must notify the Agent if there are any concerns with regards to the operation of the system. It is the renter's responsibility to keep all plants and lawns alive.

- 44.3 The Renter must park vehicles in the designated area. The Renter must not park on grass or garden areas, if it does then the Renter will be liable to fix any damage caused to the grass and grounds.
- 44.4 The Renter will be liable for any fine that is received due to the lack of upkeep of the Premises that have been issued by the local council or Owners Corporation in relation to garden maintenance, illegally parked vehicles, rubbish and the like.

45. Light Globes and Pilot Lights

- 45.1 The Renter must replace at the Renter's expense, all light tubes and globes to the Premises which become defective during the Term of the tenancy unless the defect is proven to be caused by faulty wiring.
- 45.2 The Renter is responsible for checking and relighting the pilot lights on all gas appliances such as gas hot water systems, gas heating units and gas ovens, before reporting faults to the Agent. If a tradesperson is sent by the Agent on behalf of the Rental provider to relight a pilot light where this is the only issue the Renter will be liable for all costs.

46. Pets

- 46.1 The Renter is prohibited from keeping any animal or pet of any description on the Premises without the completion of the Pet Request form. The renter provider has 14 days to make a decision. If they don't agree, the rental provider will apply to VCAT. The renter can't keep a pet while VCAT is making a decision.
- 46.2 If the Rental provider consents to the Renter keeping a pet on the Premises, the Renter hereby acknowledges and agrees to accept full responsibility for any damage or complaints resulting from keeping a pet at the Premises and further agrees to pay any and all expenses arising from any repairs or replacements to goods and fixtures.
- 46.3 Should a pet cause any damage including but not limited to urinating on the floors, or damages to the interior fixtures or fittings or surroundings area of the Premises, the Renter must report any damage caused to the Premises to the Agent within 7 days and the Renter agrees to rectify the damage or replace the flooring as soon as possible at the Renter's expense.
- 46.4 Should a pet cause any damage including but not limited to urinating on the floors, or damages to the interior fixtures or fittings or surroundings area of the Premises, the Renter must report any damage caused to the Premises to the Agent within 7 days and the Renter agrees to rectify the damage or replace the flooring as soon as possible at the Renter's expense.

47. Rubbish and hanging clothes

- 47.1 The Renter must store all rubbish and waste in a proper rubbish receptacle with a close-fitting lid, to be kept only in the place provided. The Renter must have rubbish and waste regularly removed in accordance with the municipality's rubbish and waste removal timetables.
- 47.2 The Renter must only hang clothes outside the Premises where provision for the hanging of clothes has been provided.

48. Inflammable Liquids Not Permitted

48.1 Except as allowed by this by this item 48, the Renter must not bring onto, or store, inflammable liquids, gases or automotive or machinery oils or lubricants at the Premises, including but not limited to motor fuels, kerosene and bottled gasses.

48.2 Apart from kerosene which the Renter must not have at the Premises, the Renter is entitled to keep small quantities of inflammable liquids, gases or automotive or machinery oils and lubricants it requires for purely routine minor maintenance, domestic or house-hold use or to maintain the garden at the Premises.

49. Vehicle/boat servicing or Repairs not to be carried out

- 49.1 For the purposes of this item 49, routine minor maintenance is limited to cleaning, checking and adjusting tyre pressures and checking the oil, coolant and the levels of other fluids and the general condition of the vehicle or boat. It does not include carrying out lubrication, oil changing, replacing tyres or a battery or periodic, or other, servicing whether in accordance with manufacturers recommendations or not or repairs of any sort.
- 49.2 The Renter agrees not to carry out any mechanical repairs or spray painting of any motor vehicles, boats or motor cycles in or around the Premises including common property.
- 49.3 The Renter also agrees to be fully responsible for the removal of any motor cycle, car or boat spare parts or bodies or any other equipment used and to fully reinstate the Premises or the land or common property on which it is situated to their original condition forthwith.

50. Smoke Alarms

- 50.1 The Renter acknowledges that the smoke detectors are operational at the commencement of this Lease. If the Renter becomes aware, or reasonably considers, a smoke detector at the Premises is not, or may not be, in proper working order the Renter must notify the Agent as soon as possible, and within 24 hours of becoming aware.
- 50.2 The Renter agrees to carry out tests from time to time to ensure the smoke detector is in working order. If a smoke detector appears to be faulty or does not make the required sound when tested, the Renter must immediately notify the Agent and confirm such advice in writing on the same day.
- 50.3 The Renter acknowledges and agrees that it must not remove a battery from a smoke detector. If a smoke detector makes a sound indicating the battery needs to be replaced, the Renter must change the battery and notify the Agent and confirm such advice in writing on the same day if any problem persists.

51. Swimming Pool/Spa

- 51.1 This item 51 applies if there is a swimming pool, spa or variation thereof at the Premises.
- 51.2 The Renter hereby agrees:
 - a. to maintain the swimming pool/spa by using the equipment provided;
 - b. to purchase at their own cost, the required chemicals to maintain the swimming pool/spa;
 - c. to maintain the swimming pool/spa equipment provided in the condition in which it was received at the beginning of the tenancy;
 - d. to ensure the swimming pool/spa area and surrounds are kept clear of obstacles, that the gate providing access to the swimming pool/spa/spa area is never propped open and that all children are under adult supervision at all times; and
 - e. to inform the Agent in writing immediately should the safety barrier on the swimming pool/spa/spa area require maintenance or become unsafe.
- 51.3 The Renter acknowledges and agrees that if item 51.2 is not complied with, the Agent may serve a notice of breach on the Renter and the necessary notices thereafter if the Renter fails to remedy the breach

52. Locks & Keys

- 52.1 The Renter is permitted to change the locks including the barrels in all locks at the Premises, on the condition that the Renter provides duplicate keys to the Agent within 24 hours of changing the locks.
- 52.2 The Renter is permitted to change the code of an alarm at the Premises, on the condition that the Renter notifies the Agent in writing within 24 hours of the changed alarm code.
- 52.3 The Rental provider and Renter agree that the Agent is not legally obligated to hold or provide a duplicate key to the Premises. The Agent may request a copy of keys be provided at any time and the Renter is required to provide the key with a copy of a receipt for reimbursement.
- 52.4 The Renter acknowledges that it is responsible for the replacement of any lost keys, the provision of additional keys and any locksmith charges where keys are lost or mislaid.
- 52.5 The Renter acknowledges that whilst all due care has been taken by the Rental provider and the Agent to ensure that all keys held by previous occupiers of the Premises have been returned, to ensure total security it is the Rental provider's recommendation that the barrels to locks are changed by the Renter.

53. Blockages Caused by Misuse

53.1 The Renter must not flush anything into the drainage, septic, sewerage or storm water systems that may cause a blockage. The Renter shall pay the cost of clearing any pipe, drain toilet or sewage blockages belonging to the Premises caused by misuse by the Renter or their visitors.

54. Payment Of Rental

- 54.1 All rental payments are to be made on time and in full in the manner specified in Item 8 of the standard terms or otherwise instructed by the Agent in writing. No part payments will be accepted. The Renter acknowledges and agrees that payments made by cheque or money order are subject to a \$16.50 processing fee (inclusive of GST).

- 55.2 The Renter acknowledges that a request of transfer of lease must be given to the Agent in writing and will be subject to Rental provider approval. If approved, the Renter agrees to reimburse the Rental provider for the costs and charges incurred in relation to the preparation of a written assignment of the Tenancy Agreement. The costs are \$220.00 (inclusive of GST) plus any Renter check fees (\$22.00 per new Renter), such fees are subject to change. A prospective renter must not move in or occupy the Premises without completing and submitting an application to the Agent for approval by the Rental provider.
- 55.3 For the purposes of item 55.2 to apply, at least one named Renter from the original Agreement must remain in occupation. If no original named Renter is to remain, all Renters must vacate. If this occurs during a fixed term, a lease break will occur.

- 55.4 The Renter must not grant a licence or part with occupation of the Premises, or a part of the Premises, to provide residential accommodation for a fee or other benefit, without, in each instance, obtaining the Rental provider's prior written consent, which, if given, may be subject to reasonable conditions.

56.2 The Renter will be liable for and agrees to pay the following fees and charges as applicable:

- a. any advertising costs incurred including an internet marketing cost of \$355 (inclusive of GST);
- b. a break lease fee of 2.5 Weeks' Rental (inclusive of GST), applied pro-rata;
- c. a 'For Lease' board to be erected at a cost of \$99.00 (inclusive of GST);

58. Owners Corporation Rules (Where Applicable)

If there is an owners corporation for the Premises ("Owners Corporation"), the Rental provider agrees to attach a copy of the current rules of the Owners Corporation to this Agreement.

If item 58.1 applies, the Renter agrees to observe and be bound by the rules of the Owners Corporation and any rules amending or superseding them (as the case may be) in so far as they relate to or affect the use, occupation and enjoyment of the Premises and the common property provided that the Renter shall not be required to contribute costs of a capital nature or which would, except for the provision, be payable by the Rental provider. The Standard Rules of the Subdivision (Body Corporate) Regulations 2001, as amended, apply to all bodies corporate.

If item 58.1 applies, the Renter shall not do or allow to be done anything that will cause the shared service facilities to become obstructed, untidy, damaged or used for any purpose other than for which they are intended.

59. Condensation and Mould





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
